

# Rebecca Whitfield

Georgia Washington County - In the name of God Amen

I Rebecca Whitfield of the County and State aforesaid, being desirous of arranging my worldly matter, while I have my mind and memory to do so, do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> It is my will and desire that all my just debts including a debt I owe two my negro men John & Jim for Corn, be paid as soon as practicable after my death.

Item 2<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to Thomas M. Harris in trust for Ellen Whitfield my Negro Woman Ellen and her three children Henry, Fred and John and her future increase with one years provisior for them for the sole use and benefit of the said Ellen Whitfield, not subject to the debts contracts or obligations of her present or any future Husband, she having the authority to dispose of the said negroes through the said Thomas M. to whom she shall except her present or future Husband.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath unto my two nieces Mary E Rogers and Rebecca Schwall, One Bed and furniture each, and after the payment of my debts, my will and desire is that all the balance of my property, of every kind be equally divided between my said two Nieces, Mary E Rogers & Rebecca Schwall and the children of my niece Sarah & Brothkin and the child of my Nephew J. W. Rogers deceased Share and Share alike, so that the children of the said Sarah and J. W. Rogers is to receive one fourth each of the property, so divided being only the particular that Sarah & J. W. Rogers would receive were they in life at the time of the division.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I do hereby nominate and appoint my friend Thomas M. Harris the Executor of this my last Will and Testament, having reciting all former Wills heretofore made by me.

In witness whereof I have countersigned my hand and affixed my seal, by making my mark this 12<sup>th</sup> day of April 1863

## Redding Pate

State of Georgia - In the name of God Amen,

I Redding Pate of the County of Washington and State aforesame knowing it is appointed for all men once to die, and taking into Consideration the necessity of disposing of such Mortality effects as it has pleased God to let come unto me. And being weak in body but of sound disposing mind and memory. Do make Ordain and declare this to be my last Will and Testament in the clauses and words following to wit,

In nomine, I give and bequeath my Soul into the hands of God who gave it, and my body to its mother earth, to be buried in a Christian like manner, at my death.

Also, My will and desire is that all my just debts shall be first paid from the sale of my property as soon after provided, And should my Executor hereafter named have to borrow money at an interest over eight per cent to pay my debts with. It is my will and desire that such Executor, be paid out of my estate before any charges taken.

Also, I give and bequeath to my Son John H Pate, Redding H Pate and Anthony C Pate being all the Children I now have, but should my wife Elizabeth have any more children before my death or within nine months thereafter, they all to have an equal share of the following tract of land to be divided among them, viz. when John H Pate arrives at the age of twenty one and so on successively, as the Convey age till all shall have received his portion to wit, Six lots four bush and a prior in Marion No one and ten in the ninth, part of lot N fifteen in the tenth District, N eighty five in the tenth, lot N fifty eight in the fifth District. Also N three hundred and six in the seventh early now Baker County, Also one other tract in the fifth District of Lee, about two hundred and thirty seven, now Franklin County, also N 162. One hundred and forty two, in the tenth of Marion, also Palaski County, if not sold, to be sold by my Executor a
