I Samuel Rootwin of Washington County State aforesaid being of sound and disposing Mind and Memory do make and Constitute and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, hereby revoking and nullifying and all former Wills made by me, & Not.

I desire that my body be buried in a manner suitable to the circumstances and condition of my Estate while in life

I will and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors hereafter named, being unwilling that my Creditors should be withheld from their legal rights more especially as there is no necessity for such delay.

I give and devise to my Nephew Samuel B. Robison son of my Brother Alexander I Robison, all the land I may die seised and possessed of lying between the main Road leading from Franklin to the Bridge on Buffalo Creek known as the Sheppard Bridge and the Central Rail Road which crosses the same Road and bounded on the North and east by the corner of N. St. Street

Samuel Rootwin, the Joseph Rootwin place and others and situated on the South and West by the lands of his Sonnes, John Wingfield Robison and others which includes all the lands I own in the North and West side of the Central Rail Road embracing the Cornfield also that portion of the tract owned by me on the South side of the Central Rail Road commencing at the big Oaktree on the said Rail Road and running out to the Southwest at Rock Branch, from the Rail Road line a distance of Thirteen Chains, thence down along the line of the Hell Creek in a line all the way as near South from the Rail Road as with the same direction of Chains and continuing until you come in contact the line of that tract of land owned by Charles A. Root as a Mill site and along said River line back to the Central Rail Road, then all Stock such as Horses Cows Hogs etc together with all personal implements furniture and improvements upon each and all of these I desire to leave the said Samuel B. Robison and his heirs forever that further I give and devise that sume of the property in rents and profits of said Land as may be necessary for the education of said Sonnes B. Robison to come my Senior Executor if need be required to have applied for that purpose also directing that if the amount so realized be insufficient to the sume that may be in the hands of my Senior Executor from other sources to apply for that purpose, or I with the said Robison to have a thorough education until the amount shall arrive at the age of twenty two years then I further will and direct that on the event of the death of the said Samuel B. Robison without issue before he shall have arrived at the age of twenty two years, then I will and devise that this Legacy be divided between John and Alexander sons of my Brother Alexander I Robison, John and Wingfield Robison sons of my Brother James M. Robison and Edward Robison son of my Brother William H. Robison, share and share alike and to be distributed in kind by such Commissioners as my executors may appoint, And on the event of the death of any one ~~and~~ more of them four Boys, without issue before the time hereafter set for final distribution of my Estate, then his or their parts to recd back to them of them surviving.

I give and devise to my nephews Alexander H. Robison son of my Brother Alexander I Robison that tract of land known as the three acre

whereon Francis Orr now lives supposed to contain two hundred and fifty acres more or less a plot of which I have in the possession of my Executor bounded by the estate of William A. Irvin, Hannah Kennedy and the Central Rail Road and by a tract of land wherein Albert Irvin now lives as a crippler and which will be hereafter described of in this will.

I give and devise to my four nephews John Robison son of my Brother Alexander Robison, John and Ningfield Robison sons of my Brother James McRobison and Edward Robison son of my Brother William Robison all that tract of land wherein Albert Irvin now lives containing four hundred acres more or less bounded by lands of William A. Irvin, William Knoll and other share and share alike provided they all shall live to the time of the final distribution of my estate which my Executor are instructed to divide when my nephew Samuel B. Robison shall have reached the age of twenty two years but should any one or more of those boys die before that time without issue, then his share to revert back to the survivor. This tract to be divided proportionally in lots as near equal as possible by such Committee as may serve my Executor may appoint.

I desire and will that my Executor keep a special fund out of the Assets of my Estate of Nine Thousand five hundred dollars to be disposed of as follows to pay to my Brother William A. Robison the sum of One thousand five hundred dollars per annum in semiannual instalments of fifty dollars each one third of the special fund to be exhausted till the payment I have at his death should he die before exhausting this one third share of this fund, his to the widow of my Brother Alexander Robison and the widow of my Brother Ningfield Robison similar sums in semiannual instalments as a residue for my Brother William, provided that in the event of the death or marriage of either of these widows, those shares revert to the surviving widow, these payments to be made the 1st day of January and July of each year until the funds get used for this purpose be exhausted. I direct these bequests to be paid yearly when due, and not until due.

I desire my Executor to provide out of the assets of my estate for the reasonable maintenance of certain of the heirs to the General Robison, Elizabeth and Jerry, should either or both become financially disabled from maintaining themselves provided he or she pay all their claim passing to him with me up to the time of my death.

I desire and instruct my Executor at the time of the final distribution of my Estate hereinafter directed, after having paid off all such legacies as I have given direction for to divide the remaining assets share and share alike equally between my nephews James A. Robison, Alexander W. Robison, John Robison son of my Brother Alexander, S. Robison, John and Ningfield Robison sons of my Brother James, and Edward son of my Brother William H. Robison provided always that shall ever anyone die without issue previous to that time, his or her share to revert back and be divided equally among the survivors.

I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Richard F. Hartshorn as my successor Executor, and my nephew Samuel B. Robison as my junior executor to this my last Will and Testament.

Alexander E. Larrison

The Will of Alexander E. Larrison made and declared by him on the 29th
day of July 1870 in our presence under the following circumstances:

That said Alexander, being at his home in Washington County Georgia
on the 29th day of July 1870 being near unto death in his last sickness from
which he suffered but a short time with the untried and untried were present
and after calling them to witness the manner and to whom he should
desire of his property. He declared the following to be his last Will,

I give and bequeath to my Stephen W. Evans my entire estate
both real and personal, to have and to hold and use in any manner
he may see proper so to do.

I appoint my Stephen W. Evans sole executor of this my Will.

In about six or seven hours afterwards as far as we made this Will he
died.
