I William D Walker of said State and County, being of sound and disposing mind memory, knowing that I must shortly be exposed to great dangers of my life deem it right and proper, both as respects my family and myself that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me - I do therefore make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all others by me heretofore made

First I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executor herein after named, and appointed

Secondly I give bequeath and down to my beloved wife Eliza all of my property both real and personal property during her natural life or widowhood only, then the perishable property to be equally divided between my children and my land to remain undivided until my youngest child comes of age or is married

Thirdly I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Eliza executrix of this my last Will and Testament this August 8th 1863.

Signed sealed declared and published by William D Walker as his last Will and Testament in the presence of the undersigned who subscribe our names here in the presence of the Testator at his special instance and request and in the presence of each other this August 8th 1863

Georgia Washington County, Before me Joseph M Medlock a Justice of the Peace for said County James R Smith Harriet F Harrison and Mrs Emily J Hook who being duly sworn depose and say that they were present a few hours before the death of Mrs Sarah Brown and heard her in substance declare the above as her Will in relation to the negro girl Pally, that at the time the said Sarah Brown was of sound mind and memory.
