and Testament, hereby appointing a certain Will as follows:

- Item 1st I direct that my remains be buried in a decent and christianlike
manner, suited to my circumstances in life
- Item 2^d I give & bequeath unto John S. Hunt & C. S. Hunt, my share of
Central Bank stock & interest & all other property I own and give
the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars Cash, for and use of said they
have my use, this I do with full knowledge of what I do hereby. I desire
no Children that I ever have or shall have or my children or any
of them to have any part of the said Central Bank stock or any
part of my estate.
- Item 3^d I give to my dear friend John S. Hunt one share of Central Bank
stock
- Item 4th I give to my dear friend John S. Hunt one share of Central
Bank stock
- Item 5th I give to my dear friend John S. Hunt, twenty five dollars annu-
ally from the month July until I die & until he is dead, which
sum is to be paid him the amount of my plantation or from the
out of my own property or real estate, which sum is to be invested in
Central Bank or other good stock in the accumulation of One hundred Dollars
unreverted.
- Item 6th All the rest and residue of my estate of every description
347 whatever real or personal I want sold and first together for
the support & support and benefit of my wife Stella Hunt and my dear son

Silas T. Hunt's Will

Samuel Russell Hunt until my said son arrives at the age of twenty one years, and then to be equally divided between my wife and said son.

Item 7th I desire no such construction of the 6th Item of this Will, as to prevent the sale of personal property for reinvestment as best suited to advance the best interest of the estate.

Item 8th I constitute and appoint my wife Stella T. Hunt guardian of the person and property of my son Samuel Russell Hunt. I do hereby appoint my wife Stella Hunt my Executor to my will.
