I Silas F. Hunt of said State and County, being of sound and
disposing mind and memory do hereby make and certify that I do hereby last Will
and Testament, hereby appointing a certain will in the words:

Item 1 I direct that my remains be buried in a decent and Christianlike
manner, suited to my circumstances in life.

Item 2 I give and bequeath unto John H. Hemmick, C. S. Hemmick, one share of
Central Bank Stock of Georgia. I give and bequeath unto John H. Hemmick and John
the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars. I direct, for and in lieu of interest they
have my wife, this John H. Hunt being dead as witnesses hereby. I desire
no witnesses that I am sane and of full mind and memory and of sound
disposition and I and have the control of said Central Bank of Georgia as
part of my estate.

Item 3 I give to my wife Mary Hunt one share of Central Bank
Stock.

Item 4 I give to my wife Mary Hunt one share of Central
Bank Stock.

Item 5 I give to my wife Mary Hunt, Twenty five dollars annu-
ally from the interest due until my wife is dead and then old, which
sum is to be paid to her the annual income of my plantation or from the
sum of money, fifty or real estate, which sum is to be invested in
Central Bank or other good stock in the accumulation of One hundred Dollars
uninvested.

Item 6 All the rest and residue of my real estate of every description
347 whatever real or personal I want sold and first together for
the support support and benefit of my wife Stella Hunt and my said wife

Samuel Russell Hunt until my said son arrives at the age of twenty one years, and then to be equally divided between my wife and sons.

Item 7th I desire no such construction of the 6th Item in this Will, as to prevent the sale of personal property for reinvestment as best suited to advance the best interest of the estate.

Item 8th I constitute and appoint my wife Stella I. Hunt, Guardian of the person and property of my son Samuel Russell.

I do hereby appoint my wife Stella Hunt my Executor to my will.
