In the name of God Amen,
I Eunice J. Armstrong of the State and County aforesaid being afflicted in body, but of sound mind and memory feel my duty and privilege to make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, I do therefore make this my last will and testament.

1st Item I bequeath my body to the dust and my soul to God who gave it; as I believe and have hope in the resurrection through Jesus Christ.

2^d Item I desire that all my just debts be paid without delay.

3^d Item I give and bequeath to my Brother William H. Armstrong all my negroes consisting of a woman Ann and her children Luke the Eliza Ellick and Alice to him and his heirs for ever, I make this bequest, because he has given me a Brotherly kind protection and support for over twenty two years, and has raised and supported my negroes.

4th Item I give and bequeath to my Niece Isabella Jane Armstrong daughter of my Brother William H. Armstrong my Bedstead and all my Bed furniture.

5th Item I give and bequeath my Spectacles to my Sister in Law Martha Caroline Armstrong Wife of my Brother, William H. Armstrong.

I nominate and appoint my Brother William H. Armstrong Executor of this my last Will and Testament.

Spencer Brantley

In the name of God Amen
I Spencer Brantley of the County and State aforesaid being about to leave for the State of Virginia as a volunteer in the Confederate Army, and knowing the uncertainty of life, and desiring it is a duty to make a disposition of my worldly effects, do therefore make and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all others.

Item I do leave unto my aged mother, Louisa Brantley all of my property of whatever kind or description, during her natural life to be for her support, and at her death to be disposed of as hereafter expressed.

2^d Item I give to William Wommack in trust for his wife Mary and her children my negro girl Netey about fourteen years of age.

To be held for the sole and separate use of the said Mary & Children not subject to be sold for the debts of the said William or any other person and at the death of the said Mary, the trust herein created cease and determined and all and increase to be equally divided between the Children of said Mary

Item 3rd I give unto William Mammack in trust for the sole and separate use of Nancy Brantley wife of my Brother John J Brantley and her children my negro Boy Ben about eleven years old, and my negro girl Sarah about nine years old, Also one tract of Land on which Benjamin Brantley now lives, containing one hundred acres more or less adjoining Lands of John J Brantley and Joseph D Smith

Item 4th I give to my Brother John J Brantley the tract of Land on which he now lives containing one hundred acres more or less adjoining Lands of John J Brantley and others

Item 5 It is my Will and desire that the tract of Land on which my mother now resides containing some hundred acres more or less (reserving four acres) for a burying ground at the place where my Father is buried, be equally divided at my mother's death between the Wife and Children of the said William Mammack and the Wife and Children of my Brother John J Brantley and be held by the said William Mammack, subject to the same trust use of the property conveyed in the second and third Items of this my last Will & Testament And it is also my Will and desire that all the balance of my property not herein before disposed of be sold after my mother's death, and after paying all just debts, the balance of money remaining to be equally divided between the Wife and Children of the said William Mammack and the Wife and Children of my Brother John J Brantley, subject to the aforesaid trust. I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Edward J Foreynade Executor of this my last Will and Testament, This the fifth day of November Eighteen hundred and sixty one,
