I Thomas Satter of said State and County, being of sound mind and memory, do make this my last Will & Testament
Item 1. I give, bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Nancy Satter One Thousand Dollars in money to be paid to her by my Executors hereinafter named, as soon after my death as practicable, and I also further bequeath give and devise to my during her natural life, the plantation wherein we now live, and after her death, I will and direct that my daughters Emma, Fannie & Fessie shall take charge of said plantation, work it to the best advantage, receive the rents, issues & profits therefrom during their natural lives and pay jointly into my estate the sum of Fifty Dollars annually.

Item 2. I further will and direct that in the event of either of my said daughters, Emma, Fannie and Fessie, or all of them should marry, that they still shall continue to remain on said plantation with their husbands and children, if they should have any on the conditions named in Item first.

Item 3. I further will and direct that in the event of the death of either of my said daughters, leaving issue, that such issue shall be entitled to the benefits provided for the mother in Items 1 & 2.

Item 4. After the death of the last one of my above named three daughters, I will and direct that said plantation be equally divided in value amongst all the legal heirs of my estate.

Item 5. I further will and direct, that only so much of my personal property consisting of Stocks, Notes Bonds and other evidences of debt, as well as plantation stock be sold as will be absolutely necessary to pay my just debts (if I should leave any) and the beques contained in Item first.

Item 6. I further will and direct that out of the remainder of said personal property my Executors shall pay to my daughters Emma, Fannie & Fessie, and to my grand daughter Mary Jane Jordan, for which latter I appoint my daughter Emma as trustee, amounts sufficient to make them equal in amounts already received from me by my other children, to wit: George Satter who has received Six hundred Dollars (\$600⁰⁰), Amanda C Jordan, Five hundred Dollars (\$500⁰⁰) and Berrien Satter, Three hundred Dollars (\$300⁰⁰). The said Amanda C Jordan and the said Berrien Satter, also to be made equal to my son George.

Item 7. I further will and direct that after the bequests in Item first and Item Sixth have been paid and there should still be remaining in the hands of my Executors, personal property of any kind, that the said Executors shall make an equal division thereof among all my heirs.

Item 8. I hereby nominate and appoint my daughter Emma & Fannie and my son Berrien Satter Executors of this my last Will and Testament. This 18th day of December 1883.
