In the name of God Amen

I Thomas Turlington of said State and County, being of advanced age, and knowing that I shall shortly depart from this world, deem it right and proper, as respects myself and my family that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me. I therefore revoking and annulling all others heretofore made by me.

Item 1. I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and condition. My soul I trust shall return to God who gave it - as I hope for eternal salvation through the blood of Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, whose religion I have professed and as I humbly trust enjoyed for eighteen years.

Item 2nd I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my executors hereinafter named ~~and~~ unwilling my creditors should be delayed if there is no necessity for delay.

Item 3. I give and devise to my beloved wife remaining with whom I have lived in the strictest quiet and love

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for forty six years. Tract land containing three hundred and forty acres more or less in said county known as the place I reside on with all the rights members and appertinances to tract of land in anywise belonging to her during her natural life and after her death to belong to Henry T. Turlington during his life and if he (Henry T. Turlington) should die without child or children the said tract land shall belong to my daughters Elizabeth Ann Smith and my daughter Mourning Richard and her children I also give and bequeath to my wife Mourning in the same unreserved manner the house hold and kitchen furniture after her death to be equally divided among my daughters Elizabeth Ann Smith Mourning Richard and her children and Henry T. Turlington. I give and bequeath to my wife Mourning in the same manner the farming utensils used on and belonging to said plantation of every description whatever and two mares viz. Cin and the other known as the name of the black mare also five cows and calves such as she may choose from my stock of cattle. Also twenty head of stock hogs such as she may choose from stock hogs, also ten head of choice sheep such as she may choose from my stock of sheep. I also give and bequeath to my wife Mourning the present growing crop viz. Corn, fodder, Cotton, peas and potatoes.

Item 4th. I give and bequeath to my wife Mourning one negro slave Lucy a woman about fifty one years of age after her death to dispose of as she pleases I also give and bequeath to my wife Mourning during her life time the following slaves to wit George a man about twenty seven years of age Alfred a man about twenty four years of age Jacob a boy about twenty one years of age Willy a Girl about sixteen years of age Green a boy about seven years of age Jim a boy about six years of age. All of which negroes belong to my wife Mourning during her life time and after her death to be divided among my heirs hereinafter named.

Item 5th I bequeath to my son Henry T. Turlington tract land containing three hundred and fifty nine acres more or less lying in said county on the little Chopin where he (Henry T. Turlington) now resides adjoining lands of S. R. Taylor & Phillip Clarke & others with all the rights members and appertinances to said tract of land in any wise appertaining and belonging to him the said Henry T. Turlington during his life time and if the said Henry T. Turlington should die without child or children the said tract land shall belong to my daughters Elizabeth Ann Smith and Mourning Richard and her children I also give and bequeath to my son Henry T. Turlington after the death of my wife Mourning the following negro slaves to wit Alfred a boy about twenty four years of age and John a boy about seven years of age to him the said Henry T. Turlington and his heirs for ever.

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Item 6th I bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Ann Smith after the death of my wife Mourning the following Slaves to wit George a man about twenty seven years of age and Milly a Girl about sixteen years of age. I also bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Ann Smith and Mourning Prichard & her children after the death of my wife Mourning a negro boy Green about seven years old to be sold and equally divided between Elizabeth Ann Smith & Mourning Prichard and her children.

Item 7th I give and bequeath to my daughter Mourning Prichard and her children by her present or any future husband free from disposition of her former husband Sables Prichard or any future husband after the death of my wife Mourning the following Slaves to wit a negro boy Tyscow about twenty one years of age also a certain tract or parcel of land containing three hundred and thirty eight acres and a half more or less known as the Hicks place in said County adjoining Thomas Smith John Smith & others on the waters of Lime Stone Creek to her the said Mourning Prichard and her children for ever And I appoint my trusty and worthy son Henry T. Turlington trustee for the property here in bequeath to my daughter Mourning Prichard and her children.

Item 8th It is my request that all my perishable property not herein named or willed shall be sold and equally divided among my children by Henry T. Turlington Elizabeth Ann Smith and Mourning Prichard and her children also my notes and ready money equally divided among my said children Henry T. Turlington Elizabeth Ann Smith and Mourning Prichard and her children.

Item 9th I constitute and appoint my beloved wife Mourning Executrix and my son Henry T. Turlington Executor to this my last will and Testament.

This the sixth day December Eighteen hundred and fifty six Signed, sealed, declared and published by Thomas Turlington as his last will and Testament in the presence of us the subscribers who subscribed our names here to in the presence of said testator and each other
