

Thomas Warrthen.

I, Thomas Warrthen, of Washington County Georgia, do make the following will and testament, hereby revoking any and all others heretofore made by me.
Item 1. I give to the Methodist Church of Warrthen, of which I am a member, One Thousand Dollars, which is to be securely and permanently invested and the annual interest or income paid to the Preacher in charge of the church.

Item 2. I give and devise to my partners - my brother Chacon three eights and Stephen C. Hitchcock one eight interest in the store house and lot of T. Warrthen & Co at Warrthen. Said lot fronting sixty feet on the road and running back ninety five feet. I give and devise to them also the same interests respectively in the gin and mill and the lot on which they are located, including buildings engines and machinery embracing a half acre more or less, sufficient for convenient access to the street and Rail Road and for the successful working and operation of the gin and mill.

Item 3. I direct my Executors to mark out a tract of land, which I estimate will contain about Seventy five acres more or less, to embrace the depot grounds of the A. Gr. S. R. R. and the store and gin property of T. Warrthen & Co, so that it will embrace all the land from the dwelling lot, I have deeded to S. C. Hitchcock and from Chacon Warrthen line on the southward to the Sparta road and the plantation road passing by my barns on the northward.

and on the northwestward extending and including all the timber-covered land between the Chacon Warrthen fish pond and the Sparta road, and on the southeastward embracing and including my tenant houses now known as the Alfred Warrthen and the Warrthen residence - by a line so convenience at a corner to be made on said plantation road or old race path near Alfred Warrthen's house, running southward leaving said Tenant houses in west of line to Chacon Warrthen's line and of this tract of land and all the improvements, appurtenances, machinery and appliances thereon I give bequest and devise to my brother S. C. Warrthen three-fourths interest and to my nephew Thomas Warrthen one-fourth interest given in fee simple - Subject to the interest herein before given to my partners Chacon Warrthen and S. C. Hitchcock in store and gin lots.

Item 4. I give to my beloved wife all my household and kitchen furniture or any of it as she may want. After settling all the foregoing bequests and bequests of the residue of my estate does not realize more than Fifty Thousand Dollars - then I give and bequeath the one half of it to my wife Carrie - if it should realize more than Thirty Thousand Dollars, then I give and bequeath to her the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars free and absolutely. In either event the administration of said residue to be held in trust by my Executors to pay the interest or income to her for and during her natural life - and at her death to be divided equally between all my brothers and sisters - share and share alike - the children of any who may be dead to take the share of such deceased parent. This bequest to be in lieu of dower.

Item 5. My Executors shall have power and authority to continue my business as may be engaged in, in their discretion and may take ten years in managing and realizing my assets in the execution of this will, if necessary so much in their judgment. And they shall have power to sell at publick sale for cash or on time any part of my property real or personal not herein specifically devised and to reinvest proceeds if necessary in their judgment - and to compromise, compound and settle any debt due my estate

or any other matters of dispute or difference all in their discretion without the
order, decree or judgment of any court whatever. And either one of them
shall have the right to buy any part of my estate, which is not specifically
divided or bequeathed hereby, as fully as if they were not Executors.

Item 6: I appoint my brother George Warrthen one my nephews Thomas
Warrthen now Executors of this my Will, and in my death or other
disqualification but one of them shall be acting, he shall have all the power
and authority herein given to both.

L. B. Price Jun: being of sound and disposing mind
and memory, do make this my last Will and Testament.

Item 1: I desire that my tract of land bounded on the north by Little Ochafie
giver, east by W. B. Price and Ogden Price, south by Marion Price and
west by Emanuel Price, containing two hundred acres more or less and lying
and being in the 1884 District 4. M. of said county be sold and all my debts
and burial expenses be paid from the proceeds thereof. Since I desire that my son
"Birger" Price be paid him \$100 Dollars, and my two daughters Georgia &
Mary be paid each Fifty (\$50) Dollars; the remainder to rest in and become
the property of my wife Mary Price, for the support and maintenance of herself
and our two sons, Luther and Otis, and also my two daughters Georgia and
Mary, should they remain with their stepmother, which I desire they should do.

Item 2: I give and bequeath to my two daughters Georgia and Mary, two feather
beds, bedsteads and all the bed clothing connected therewith, which I already
recognize, and which they understand as their own property.

Item 3: I give and bequeath to my wife Mary Price, so long as she remains
my widow, that tract or parcel of land, known as my old home place
in said District 4. M. bounded north and west by Wm Waller, east and south
by Emanuel Price, containing One hundred acres more or less, and also all personal
property not enumerated above of every kind and character, which I may
then and be possessed of at the time of my death. Should my wife marry again
or at her death, said property is to rest in and become the property of our two
sons Luther and Otis. Should either of these two sons, Luther or Otis die before
the marriage or death of their mother, then his portion is to rest in and become
the property of the other, and should both of these sons die before marriage or death
of their mother, then it is to rest in and become the property of my two daughters
Georgia and Mary.

Item 4: I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Mary Price, and my brother
Emanuel Price Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
