I, Griselda A. Youngblood being of sound and disposing memory, do make this my last Will and Testament.

Item 1: I give, bequeath and devise to my husband Abraham Youngblood, all my estate, both real and personal, of which I may die seized and possessed for and during the full term of his natural life; and at his death, to all my children share and share alike, and if any of my children are dead at the time of his death, then the share herein given to such deceased child or children is to go to his, her or their children: representatives of children to take the share to which the parent would be entitled if living at the death of my said husband.

As my said husband is growing old and is becoming more and more unable to manage a living, I give and devise to him, during his life, all my estate for his subsistence and maintenance, and the same is not to be subject to nor liable for any of his past debts, liabilities, and contracts; but I give and devise him this life estate, except a any debt which he may contract after my will goes into effect.

As none of his past debts, liabilities and contracts were made upon the faith of my estate, herein bequeathed to him for life, I do not deem it unjust to make no provision for his support in his old age, and to give him this life estate free from his past debts, liabilities and contracts. I make this bequest to him under the protection of law, which permits me to make any disposition of my property, not inconsistent with the laws or customs to the further policy of the State.

Item 2: I hereby constitute and appoint my friend G. G. Haddell executor of this my last Will and Testament.

Dated this the 18<sup>th</sup> day of July 1863.
