Item fifth I give and bequeath to my Grand Children William E. Nancy Mary & Kennedy and Ann E. Kennedy in the manner hereinafter specified my negro woman Fanny to their own proper use and benefit

Item sixth I desire and direct that the property above bequeathed be kept together on the land together with the Stock of Cows Hogs and on Horse and plantation tools and to be worked for the benefit of the family and to provide a home and support for my three Grand Children above named until the youngest one of them becomes fourteen years of age. I then desire and direct that the property be divided according to the above items

Item seventh I give and bequeath to my son William D. if living at the time of the Division of the property above named, all the Stock of Cattle Hogs Horses plantation tools provisions and all that pertains to the place, to his own proper use and benefit; But if he is not living at the time, I desire and direct that all the property mentioned in this item be sold and the proceeds divided between the legation, giving to my three Grand Children above named an equal share,

Item eighth I constitute and appoint my son William D. and my Brother James M. Palmer Executors to this my last Will and Testament.
