I William P. Hardwick of said state and county being of advanced age, though sound mind & knowing that I must shortly depart from this world, do in its right and proper book as respects myself and my family that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me. I therefore make this my last Will and Testament hereby publishing and announcing all others heretofore made by me Item first. I desire and direct that my Body be buried in a decent manner. My Soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it.

Item Second. I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors here after named.

Item Third. I give and devise to my beloved wife Sarah H. Hardwick the following named Bequests to wit: George Fortune, Jane, Nancy and her child George Amanda and her two children Bob and an infant child. Yellow Henry, Canada & Harriet together with their increase free from all charge or limitation what ever to her own proper behoof forever, with full power to dispose of the same, at anytime before or at her death as she may think proper. I also give and bequeath my wife Sarah all my Household and Kitchen furniture including Silverware gold watch &c Piano Forte in the same unreserved manner.

Item Fourth I devise the following named Negroes viz: old Harry Henry and her two children Lloyd Clayton Belknap & little Harry Sturby, Liza Julia Ann Ann Cherry and Elsie, Lee, Sipha, Miles, Sam Bill Caesar, Simon, Hills, Solomon, Nancy, & others. Together with their increase as also all my stock of Horses Mules cattle Hogs Sheep & goats and all my plantation farming & blacksmith tools Wagons carts bins corn sheller's &c &c to remain together on the plantation where I now reside lying on both sides of Williamson's Swamp known as the following settlements a tract of land (viz) Kealey, Curn, D. Connick, Flomoy and two tracts, one granted to said W. P. Hardwick, the above lying on the North east side of Williamson's Swamp on other tract a lot of land known originally as the Hilliard Crook's land of late as the Bruch place and a small portion of a lot granted to Joseph Connery being part of the Curn tract, lying and being on the South west side of said Williamson's Swamp the whole amount supposed to contain three thousand acres more or less for purpose of keeping up the same until the proceeds of the sale of the same after paying my debts and expenses of the plantation annually to my wife and W. P. Hardwick to dispose of as she thinks proper.

Item Fifth. I desire the following described lot of land sold at the discretion of my Executors here after named without any action of court and process applied to payment of my debts.

Lot #163. 5 District Carroll County drawn by and granted to Peyton Jackson containing two hundred two and a half acres. No 3 H. lot Carroll drawn by and granted to W. G. Loring containing 203^{1/2} acres one half lot No 342. 11 Dist Carroll to draw by and granted to Ira A. Mountain Containing 101^{1/4} acres No 344-37. 3. of Cherokee drawn by and granted to William Seines No 207. 6. 2. Cherokee drawn by and granted to William Boughton Containing 205^{1/4} acres Nos 230, 241, 3 Cherokee drawn by and granted to S. H. Davidson Containing 203^{1/4} acres also No 37. 3. 3. No 246. 17. 4. No 376. 19. 2. each containing 100 acres lying in Cherokee to half of lot No 84. 13. district of Habersham drawn by and granted to William Banwick containing 125 acres I also desire that my negroes hereafter named effect sale at their option of two tracts land lying and being in Jefferson County one containing 243 acres and the other 100 acres. I also request and desire that the negro Billie named in Item Fourth be sold by my Executor if an opportunity presents itself of getting him with his wife and family and that the money be applied to the purchase of an other hand to fill his place in the farm.

Item Sixth - I desire that after the death of my wife Sarah A. Hardwick that all property named in Item Fourth and any and all other property which I possess not named in this will be equally divided between my four children Robert A. Hardwick, Charles W. Hardwick, Thomas W. Hardwick & Sarah A. Williamson & her children free from the care of her present husband Eldridge C. Williamson or any future Husband, and I appoint my son Robert A. Hardwick Trustee for the property herein bequeathed to my daughter Sarah A. Williamson and her children.

Item Seventh I constitute and appoint my son Robert A. Hardwick, my worthy friend Matthew C. Williamson and my son Thomas W. Hardwick Executors to this my last will and testament this January 24th 1855.
