Item 6th I give and bequeath to George Higgins and Howell Mayo all that portion of my Estate that may fall to the lot of my son Benjamin Mayo forever in fee simple, in trust nevertheless for the sole use and benefit of the children of the said Benjamin

Item 7 I hereby constitute and appoint George Higgins and Howell Mayo Executors of this my last Will and testament this 25 day of July 1844.
