William P Taylor Will

In the name of God Amen.

I William P Taylor of the County of Washington State of Georgia
being in common health both of body and mind, but having to
mind the uncertainty of life and before some it capricious & perh[aps] to
dispose of the property with which I have been blessed so much as
to make this my last will and testament, in manner and form following
viz, First & principally I command my soul to God & body to the earth,
and as touching my estate I do give devise & dispose of the same as
follows. I leave to my beloved wife Maria Taylor for and during the term
of her natural life one half of my plantation and the use of plantation & its
lame, also the use of one half of my dwelling house and out houses
and the following negro slaves to wit Cunfsey, Harry, Eliza, Charlotte
Hannett during her natural life also my cabin & work, my gray mare
Buggay, and mule called Charley w[ith] their horses & furniture and provis[ion]
able to serve her one year, also one third of my plantation tools six head
of cattle also twenty head of stock hogs, five head of sheep

I give bequest to son Elbert P Taylor the following negro slaves
to wit Fortune, Grace, Sally, Lewis, Caroline besides what I have already
given them together with their issue and increase of the same to him
and his heirs forever.

I give devise and bequeath to my son James P Taylor the
following negro slaves to wit, Marshall, John, Lucie & Maria
& Edmund & Hannett at my wifes death, Hannett not until my

wifes death, with their future issue and increase besides what I have already given him before to him and his heirs forever.

I give demise and bequeath to my son William L Taylor my home tract of land wherein I now live containing nine hundred and twenty acres more or less, begining at a Hickry Comb in the fork of Brooks Branch and running to Adams land, being the west part of my land and at the death of my wife, the part that I loaned to her being a part of the same plantation to go to my son William L Taylor also I give to my son William L Taylor the following negro slaves to wit Black Little Evans, Maffida, Hope, Mrs Collins Henry, also at the death of my wife, Dempsey, Mary, Elija & Bradis together with their future issue & increase of the same, to him and his heirs forever also my Cotton Gin and running gear my small Horse Buck and one Hoss called Mike also two Cows & one heifer fifteen head of Stock Hogs and four head of Sheep, also one third of my plantation tools also provisions to serve him one year after my death also one bed and steat furniture and my Wristle.

I give and bequeath unto my four grand children William A Lewis, Milly A Lewis, Thomas A Lewis & Joshua A Lewis, One hundred dollars to be equally divided among them, to be paid by my Executors in two years after my death.

I give to my three sons Elbert D. James & William L Taylor the balance of my land to be equally divided between them three.

I wish my Executors after my death to sell any property that I do not dispose of and pay my just debts & legacies and not the sum of their not being enough to do the same, my wife and sons to all bear an equal part of the same, and the first division left to my wife undisposable which may remain at her death I wish to be equally divided between my three sons above named, & their Heirs at my death I give one half of Chairs in the House & one half of the Crockery ware & one half of the Kitchen furniture & one Mahogany Table & pine board, to my wife her lifetime and then to be equally divided between my three Sons.

The other half of the said Crockery & Kitchen furniture I give to my son William L Taylor only I give to my son William L Taylor the Mahogany Table and one pine board. Any property or portion of property that I may have at my death that is not disposed of, Notes of money I wish to be equally divided between my three sons wife Lastly I constitute nominate and appoint my two sons Elbert D. Taylor and James R. Taylor Executors of this my last will & Testament hereby ratifying confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament.
