make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all
others heretofore made by me

First I desire and desire that my Executors hereinafter named
sell such of my property, as they think advisable for the purpose of
paying off and discharging all my just debts

Secondly, I leave to my beloved wife Mary Brantley for and during
her natural life, all the property of whatever kind or description I may
possess, after my just debts have been paid, and at her death, my will
and desire is that said property be equally divided, one moiety of which
is to vest in Solomon D Brantley in trust for Mary Brantley wife
of said Solomon D and her children, the other moiety to vest in William S
Brantley in trust for his wife Mary M Brantley and her children

Thirdly It is my will and desire that at any time during the exis-
tence of the life Estate herein created it become necessary to sell or
change any portion of the property, that my Executors hereinafter named
shall have power to do so by and with the consent of my beloved wife
Mary

Fourthly I constitute and appoint my two sons Solomon D Brantley
and William S Brantley Executors to this my last Will and Testament
