I give and bequeath unto William W. Cauley, my son four cows and calves and one feather bed. I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Manning after my death two cows and calves, I give and bequeath unto my loving wife and the heirs of her body my mare and all the remainder of my cattle and hogs, my house and furniture and my plantation tools my inheritance and land until her death and then divide it to be divided equally between the heirs, viz. James Leighton Thomas Erastus Jane Ann Elizabeth and William W. Cauley and equal share of the land only.
