and Mechanic tools, which I give, bequeath and
devise to my son John W. Humphries, and my
three grand sons, John Matthew Humphries, and
William Oscar Humphries, and Alfred C. Humphries.

And my beloved wife Mary Jane Humphries,
to have my remaining property for and
during her natural life, to use at her will and
pleasure, and at the death of the said Mary
Jane Humphries, the remainder of my estate to
be equally divided between my son John W.
Humphries, and my three grand sons John
Matthew Humphries, William Oscar Humphries,
and Alfred C. Humphries, each share and share
alike. - And I hereby appoint and constitute
my son, John W. Humphries, my executor, to this
my last will and testament - The name Alfred
C. Humphries, being subscribed on the twelfth line

at and before the signing and sealing of these
