State and county, being of
sound age, but of sound and disposing
mind and memory, knowing that I must
shortly depart this life; deem it right and
proper both as respects my family and myself
that I should make a disposition of the
property with which a kind providence
has blessed me, I do therefore make this my
last Will and Testament hereby revoking
and annulling all others by me heretofore
made.

First - I desire and direct that my body
be buried in a decent and Christianlike
manner, suitable to my circumstances and
condition in life - my soul I trust shall
return to rest with God, who gave it, and hope
for salvation through the merits and atonement
of the blessed Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Secondly - I desire and direct that all my
just debts be paid without delay by my ex-
ecutor hereinafter named and appointed.

Thirdly - I give, bequeath and devise to my
beloved children John M. C. and Mattie E.
lot of land containing two hundred acres
more or less - the said lot contains my present
residence. Also, that other lot of land known
as the Robinson lot, containing three hundred
acres, with all the rights, members and appur-
tenances to each of said lots of land in any
wise belonging. My daughter Mattie E. however,
is to have half interest in the above described
lots of land, only, during her single or un-
married life, at her death or marriage, then
the above lots of land is to go to my son, John
M. C. singly, to his own proper use benefit
and enjoyment forever in fee simple.

Fourthly - I give, bequeath and devise to my two

daughters, Rosalie E. Stevens, and Mattie E. Trowell, that other lot of land, known as the Patrick lot containing three hundred acres, to be equally divided between them.

Fifthly - I give and bequeath to my daughter in law, Sothie P. Trowell, five dollars.

Sixthly - I desire and direct that, if my grand-son William M. Trowell, should live to be twenty one years old, that my son John M. C. pay him two hundred dollars.

Seventhly - The residue of my property, both real and personal, wherever and whatever it may be, I give and bequeath to my beloved children, Rosalie E. Stevens, Mattie E., and John M. C. Trowell, to be equally divided among them.

Eighthly - I hereby constitute and appoint my son John M. C. Executor of this my last will and Testament. This August 26th 1882.
