my worldly affairs while I have strength
do hereby make and publish this
to be my last Will and testament
hereby revoking all will by me at any
time heretofore made and first I
commit my soul to God when given.
It and my body I desire to be buried
in the Family Burial Ground by the
side of my first Wife in said County
and my worldly estate I dispose of as
follows

First I give and bequeath
unto my daughter Syrah Leverage
Bealley all my home place that I
now live on it being Number 117
and bounded as follows commencing
on a White Oak near the Allens then
East @ Canal line to a White
oak corner near the river then
down the river to the original line
thence around the original line
to the beginning corner containing one
hundred and eighty seven acres
or 187 1/2 Acres more or less and all
my personal property that I am
now possessed of in any way having
heretofore given to my other children
as much as I have Syrah

Second I wish my Trusty friend Isaac
Oakes to be my Executor to see that
this my last Will is carried out
according to the provisions herein
contained In Witness whereof I the
said James Bealley to this my last Will
have set my hand and seal this the
17th day of December 1864 James Bealley

and Testaments in the presence of us who at
his request were in presence of each other
have subscribed our names as witnesses here
