In the name of God Amen
 I Wp. La. Truham of Habersham County and State
 of Georgia being somewhat diseased in body
 but of sound mind memory and understanding
 praise be to God for it and considering the certainty
 of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof
 and to the end I may be the better prepared
 to meet this world when it shall please God to
 call me home for I have made and declare this
 my last Will and Testament in manner following
 that is to say

First and principally I commend my soul
 into the hands of Almighty God my Creator
 hoping for His pardon and remission of all
 my sins and to enjoy everlasting happiness
 in the Heavenly Kingdom during Jesus Christ
 my Redeemer my only Comforter to the Earth
 at the time of my death I have after name
 secondly I will that all my Debtors be shall
 be by me during or my death together with my
 personal effects and all charges touching the
 same for otherwise concerning this my
 Will shall in the first and of my personal
 debts and effects be fully paid and satisfied
 then my will is that all the residue of
 my estate both real and personal when
 with its sale please God to instruct me

I dispose of the same as follows
 (1st) First I will give unto my beloved wife Wp. La. Truham two lots
 of Land situated in Habersham County
 in the second district Habersham County
 and State of Georgia including the whole
 farm as being the home plantation and
 part of lot number one hundred and
 ninety in the third district Habersham Co
 containing one hundred acres more or less
 also my interest in lot number one hundred
 and ninety one in the third district Habersham
 Co. it being the one ninth part and all
 the benefit and profits arising from the
 same with all appurtenances thereto belonging in

House & Mills & ways & water & minerals & a
one Jersey wagon and harness and plantation
wagon all my farming utensils and negro
man slave named Sam and one negro
woman slave named Suckey all my House
hold and kitchen furniture all my stock
of every kind Horses cattle dogs and such
securing her natural life also all my land
money &c &c.

I also will that my son John
Freeman shall be equal with my wife
Edith Freeman in matters in the before
named property and he remain in joint
possession and joint privilege on the
same during his natural life.

I also give and bequeath unto my son
John Freeman one negro man slave named
Wend and further bed and stone and furniture
during his natural life and if he should
die without a lawful wife then the
said negro man slave and all belonging to
be sold and the proceeds equally divided
amongst my other heirs.

To my three daughters Lydia Hunt Thana
Adams, Elizabeth Cullitt and Edith only
on the line of their body I give & bequeath
one negro man slave named Sam. Two lots of
land one on the water number one hundred
and eighty eight third district Habersham County
Ga. number seven hundred and eighty nine
in the first district and part of section number
thirty six of the line of survey & also my
undisposed of part of lot number twelve
in the second district Habersham Ga.

I Louing and conveyer away part of their
lot all to be sold and the proceeds to be
equally divided amongst them with this
exception that Edith Adams (sister of
Sam) W. Adams and Thana his wife.

That the said Edith Adams receive out
of Thana Adams part Eighty dollars more
then any of them for the
