

Record of William McKinney's Will
State of Georgia
White County

In the name of God Amen.
I William McKinney of said State and County being of advanced age but of sound and disposing mind and Memory. Knowing that I must shortly depart this life desire it right and proper both as respects my family and myself that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me.
I do therefore make this my last Will and testament, hereby revoking and annulling all others by me heretofore made.

First

I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner. Suitable to my Circumstances and Condition in life. My Soul I trust shall return to rest with God Who gave it as I hope Salvation through the merits and atonement of the Blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Secondly

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors hereinafter named and appointed.

Thirdly-

I give and bequeath and devise to my beloved Wife Mary McKinney all the household and Kitchen furniture to her own use and benefit and that at her disposal as she may deem proper.
Also One Cow and Calf

Furthermore that she shall have ample support off of all my lands. That each of the Children pay their proportionable part off of the land. I bequeath to them for her support. If they should fail to do that my Executors see that the land is rented out for the purpose above mentioned. Or as much as will

Fourthly - I give and bequeath to my Son
Ballus W. McKimney the home place
Wherein I now live part of lot number
One hundred and one in the Second
district of Originally Wabersham now White
County described in a deed made to me by
Andrew Dorsey containing One hundred
and Sixty two acres and one half acres
more or less. With the following exceptions
That if my beloved Wife Mary McKimney
desires a home that she is to have the
use of the house and garden wherein I
now live. Or any lots for Cultivation
she is to have the use and benefit of the
same also she is to have any fruit out
of the Orchard she may want.

Fifthly - I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter
Louisa Addeline Brewer, Mary E. F. Brownlow
and Rebecca Louisa Hogan One lot of Land
number One hundred and Sixty three in
the Second district of Originally Wabersham
now White County.
To my first daughter Louisa A. Brewer
the middle part of the lot containing the
House and Orchard also to my two other
daughters above named have equal rights
to the fruit of the Orchard and a right of
way to go to and from. Also to Mary
Elvira Francis Brownlow One hundred acres
of land on the east part of said lot number
One hundred and Sixty three in said district
a conditional line already established and
agreed upon. To my daughter Rebecca
Louisa Hogan the West part of lot number
One hundred and Sixty three in said
district. The middle and West part
to be equally divided between my two
daughters Louisa A. Brewer and Rebecca
Louisa Hogan.

Williams McKimney's Will Continued.

The title to be in each of my daughters as above named and described as they shall live and then the title to pass into their children and the same shall not be subject to any debts of their present husbands or any future husbands or any debts they may contract themselves. Also that my son Balus W. McKimney in like manner shall have full right and privilege to the land bequeathed to him the title to be in him as long as he shall live and then to pass into his children and not subject to any debts he or they may contract.

Sixth - I desire that all my personal property be sold and equally divided at my death except what I have given to my beloved wife Mary McKimney among my sons Balus W. Louisa Adeline Mary E. H. and Rebecca Lavada.

Seventh - I hereby constitute and appoint my son Balus W. McKimney and Jeremiah S. Brownlow Executors of this my last Will and testament This November 14th 1882.
