Item 4th I will and bequeath to my oldest son Isaac M Roberts a good saddle horse and one Hundred and Fifty Dollars in money as a set of regalia one Hundred Dollars advanced to my eldest daughter and also a one fifth interest in all my lands above described in the County of Murray

Item 5th I will and bequeath to my second son David a good saddle horse, saddle and bridle and one Hundred Dollars in money and one fifth interest in all my lands above described in the County of Murray

Item 6th I will and bequeath to my third son Jeremiah Roberts a horse bridle and saddle and one Hundred Dollars and also one fifth interest in all my lands above described in the County of Murray

Item 7th I will and bequeath to my youngest daughter Louisa one Hundred Dollars to be paid her when she comes of age also a horse bridle and saddle and one fifth interest in all my lands above described in the County of Murray the said interest in the said lands to be kept as her dower divided for her sole use and benefit and the benefit of her children should she ever have any until I am gone

Item 8th I will and bequeath that all my lands in Murray be used and enjoyed for the mutual benefit of all my children by them until the youngest one shall arrive of age or sooner to be disposed of by sale and the proceeds divided should it appear most advantageous for their interest.

Item 9th I will and direct that after the death of my beloved wife all my property of every description, both real and personal, with all that may be due my estate all the ready money she may have be divided equally among all my children.

Item 10th I nominate and hereby appoint my oldest son Isaac M. Roberts my sole Executor of this my last will and testament feeling assured that he will faithfully execute the same signed sealed and delivered in the presence of

5th It is my will that my son Thos C. Williams is the lawful Executor of this my last will and Testament, also, that he, Thos C. Williams be the lawful guardian for my minor children, to wit: John W. Williams, Sarah A. W. Williams, Harris P. Williams, Sexton R. Williams. This May 11th 1859.
