I Thomas Milie being weak in body but of sound mind and
memory calling to recollection that it is once appointed
God for all men to die make and ordain this my last
will and Testament, my last will that God doeth
pleasure with and my body that my family and
acquaintance bury in a Christian like manner and
after which it hath pleased God to Bless me with
as to wordly Estate I will it may be divided in
manner and form following. Item I give my wife
Elizabeth Milie all my stock of every description together
my household and Kitchen furniture working Tools &c
for her to dispose with as she thinks proper and all
my just debts is to be paid out of land as to my
children I give my sons William Thomas Elizabeth Jane and
John I think I have given them heretofore what will make them
equal with my other children not yet named in this will and
my son in law James Henson and Sariah his wife I will that he should
have one fourth part of my land which is forty acres to be laid
off in the South west corner of my lot of land that I now live on
the balance of the lot to be divided between my other three
sons Samuel and John when the youngest becomes
age & may be divided either by purchase or survey I now
appoint my wife Elizabeth Milie and James Henson to ex-
ecute to this my last will and Testament as witnesses I have
hereunto set my hand Seal Interlined before signed
