of Thomas Wilie being weak in body but of sound mind and
memory calling to recollection that it is once appointed
God for all men to die make and ordain this my last
will and Testament, my last will that God doeth in
pleasure with and my body that my family and
acquaintance bury in a Christian like manner and
after which it hath pleased God to bless me in
as to worldly Estate I will it may be divided in
manner and form following Item I give my wife
Elizabeth Wilie all my stick of every description together
with household and Kitchen furniture looking Tools etc
for her to dispose with as she thinks proper and all
my just debts is to be paid out of land as to my
son George my Sons William Thomas Elizabeth Stone and
John I think I have given them before what will make
equall with my other children not yet named in this will and
my Son in law James Henson and Sarah his wife I will that he shall
have one fourth part of my land which is forty acres to be taken
of in the south west corner of my lot of land that I now live on
the balance of the lot to be divided between my other three
sons Samuel Andrew and John when the youngest becomes
age & may be divided either by purchase or Survey I now
appoint my wife Elizabeth Wilie and James Henson to exec-
ute to this my last will and Testament as witness I have
hereunto set my hand seal Interline before signed

of the said will said testator was of sound and disposing mind and

tor and at his special instance and request and in the presence of each
other before me this 7th June 1852
