In the Name of God Amen,
I Frederick Barrow of the County
and State aforesaid being of
advanced age, but of sound Mind
knowing the uncertainty of life,
and deeming it right and proper to
Make a distribution of the property
with which a kind Providence has
blessed me. Make this My Last
Will & Testament hereby revoking
all other wills heretofore by me made.

Article 1st

I desire that after My death My
body be Buried in a decent and
Christian like Manner suitable to
my Condition and Circumstances in
life.

Article 2nd

I Will & desire that as soon after
My death as Circumstances Will
admit that My just debts be paid
by My Executor hereinafter named
out of the Effects of My Estate
or out of him Money that I may
have at the time of death or that
come into the hands of My said
Executor from any other source

Article 3rd

I Will & bequeath to My Wife Lucinda
Barrow four hundred Dollars (\$400) and
one Bed Bedstead & furniture. The Money
to be kept in the hands of My Executor
hereinafter named to be appropriated
by him to & for her support use & benefit
and at her death the amount that may

that has not been Consumed by My
said Wife to revert back and become
a part of My Estate and Equally
divided Among the parties hereinafter
named.

I give and bequeath to Mary Nettie
the one South part of My Estate both
Real & personal always Excepting the
legacies bequeathed in Item the Third
(3rd)

I give & bequeath to My adopted
Daughter Nancy Brown now the Wife
of James M. Griffin the one South part
of My Estate both Real & personal
always Excepting the legacies bequeathed
in Item the Third (3rd)

Item 6th

I give & bequeath to My adopted
Daughter Elizabeth John Brown now
the Wife of Eldred Brown the one South
part of My Estate both Real & personal
always Excepting the legacies bequeathed
in Item Third (3rd)

Item 7th

I give and bequeath to James H.
Hosetto the one South part of My Estate
both Real & personal always Excepting
the legacies in Item the Third (3rd)

Item 8th

I give and bequeath to Elizabeth Nettie the
one South part of My Estate both Real and
personal always Excepting the legacies
in Item the Third (3rd)

I give and bequeath to Madison D. Hewitt the one fourth part of my Estate both real & personal always Excepting the legacies bequeathed in Item the Third (3rd)

Item 10th

I give and bequeath to George H. Hewitt the one fourth part of my Estate both real & personal always Excepting the legacies in Item the Third (3rd)

Item 11th

I give & bequeath to Philip Hewitt the one fourth part of my Estate both real & personal always Excepting the legacies in Item the Third (3rd)

Item 12th

I give & bequeath to Mary Margaret Hewitt the one fourth part of my Estate both real & personal always Excepting the legacies in Item the Third (3rd)

Item 13th

I will and desire that if Mary Hewitt mentioned in Item the 12th should give birth to an other Child in the year (Eighteen hundred & 67) that if the said Child be entitled to and inherit the one fourth part of my Estate both real & personal always Excepting the legacies in Item the Third (3rd)

I hereby constitute and appoint James C. Farnell of the County and State aforesaid My Executor with full power to Carry out and execute this My last Will and Testament
