In the Name of God, Amen
I, Frederick Faircloth of the County
of Wilcox & State of Georgia, being
of Sound Mind & Memory, & being
desirous to settle my worldly affairs
while I have strength so to do,
do make & publish this my last
Will & Testament, hereby revoking
all Wills by me at times heretofore
made.

1st I Commit my Soul to God
Who gave it, and beg God, I
desire to be Buried in a Christian
like Manner, and my worldly Estate
disposed off as follows.

2nd I give & Bequeath
to my beloved Wife, Nancy Faircloth
for and during her Natural life to
dispose of as she may see fit.

Lot of Land Number Ninety-two
(92) Acreage, my Residence
also Twenty (20) Head of Cattle
her choice out of all her Stock of
Cattle, and Twenty (20) Head of
hogs her choice out of all her
Stock of hogs and fifteen head
of sheep her choice out of all
my Stock of sheep, and my
Bay Mare and Buggy and all
of my Farming Tools of Every
Description, and all my House
hold of Furniture and
Kitchen Furniture and all
provision I may have on hand.
