I therefore make this my last Will and Testament
hereby revoking and annulling all others heretofore
made by me

I want to desire and direct that all my just
 debts be paid without delay by my executor
 herein after named as from unwilling my
 creditors should be delayed of their
 rights especially as there is no necessity for delay
 I have ^{now} given one devise to my wife Francis
 part of lot 67 ~~more~~ number one hundred
 and forty seven lying in the first district
 of originally given me with ~~and~~ ^{and} ~~containing~~
 213 acres on the west side of said lot during
 her natural life and no longer hereby
 restricting my said wife Francis
 from selling timber off of said parcel of
 land and only using timber for plantation
 purposes

Plum 3 I give and devise to my said wife
all of my house hold & kitchen furniture
excepting my fire safe and writing desk
also I give to my said wife all my stock
of hogs also all the corn and bacon I may
have at my death also all my farming
tools horse cart & buggy excepting my
two horse teams and my mill & two
boilers during my said wife's life and at
her death all the furniture stock of
hogs and plantation tools devised

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to her I direct to be sold by my executors
hereafter named and equally divided among
my ten children viz. Mary, Susan, Martha
Celia Ann, Richd. S., Mary J. & Sarah.

I bury in George W. and S. B. Rice and
my grand daughter Jane Brown also
I devise to my said wife one horse or mule as
she may choose during her life and then
to be sold and equally divided as before
mentioned.

I Item 4 I devise to my said wife all of a certain
Stock of cattle marked Swallow fork under
& over bit in one ear and a pearsquare in the other
ear & brander thus & R. without reserve to
dispose of as she may think proper.

I Item 5 I Give and devise to my son G. W. Rice
three lot one parcel of land viz. Lot 1115
to 126 one at the death of my wife 2215
acres of lot 1 to 121 all being in the first
district of originally I give now Wilcox
County & State of Georgia also I Give to
my said son George W. my old Bible
I Item 6 I Give to my son Quincy Rice my
iron safe

I Item 7 I Give to J. W. Washburn my
writing Desk

I Item 8 I Give to my son S. B. Rice
my new Bible

I Item 9 I direct my Executors hereafter named
to divide all the remainder of my
property both real and personal
equally among my ten children
here to fore named and my grand
daughter Jane Brown by Sale
or otherwise.

I am 10th I constitute & appoint Drury K
 Samuel B Reed & James W. Washburn
 Executors to this my last will and
 testament hereby revoking all
 other made by me. The sixteenth day
