

# James B. Fitzgerald's Will

State of Georgia 3

Wilcox County 3 In the name of God  
Amen. I James B. Fitzgerald of said  
State & County, being about to depart  
and enter into the Confederate Army,  
and knowing that I am liable to  
depart this life, deem it right and  
proper, both as respects my wife, Brothers  
& Sisters and myself that I should make  
a disposition of the Property with which  
the kind providence has blessed me, do  
therefore make this my last will and  
Testament hereby revoking all others  
heretofore made by me.

1<sup>st</sup> I desire and direct that all my  
Land and Stock be sold and my debts  
due me and which hereafter shall due  
be collected on the event I depart  
this life before I return home from  
the war

2<sup>nd</sup> I desire and direct that all my  
just debts be first paid by my  
Executor hereinafter appointed

3<sup>rd</sup> I give, bequeath and devise to my  
beloved wife Elizabeth the full sum  
of Three hundred Dollars in lawful  
Money which is to be raised from the  
sale of my effects a bond named  
which sale is to be immediately  
after my death

My Effects to be equally divided  
between my Brothers and Sisters them  
and their heirs and their heirs

after all Expenses of Sale and other incidental Charges paid such as are just and right-

H<sup>th</sup> I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved Father Executor of this my last will and Testament-
