

The nuncupative Will of Wright Tombertin

State of Georgia, we John Tombertin, George R. Tombertin and Martha Tombertin

was present on Friday September 17 in the year of our Lord 1886 at the residence of Wright Tombertin before and at the time of his death about 10 hours before his death in perfect possession of his mental faculties as appeared to us said Wright Tombertin called upon the lay Stenders and upon the under signed in pettitioner to render and take notice of him as a test to say when he said that he gave to his son Wright S. Tombertin Lot of Land & to say, 1.10, in the first district of said County and State containing four hundred & twenty acres also the Bay horse mare named Mager and desired his beloved wife Martha Tombertin would see that his wishes and desires in this regard were carried fully out and controlled said named property for his son Wright S. Tombertin till he became twenty one years of age also to control the person of said Wright S. Tombertin until he became of age he Wright Tombertin further further requested the undersigned to bear in mind that he owed Betty Fitzgerald his daughter one hundred dollars that she had now kind of shewing face and that the money was at that time in the house so he requested and desired that his beloved wife Martha Tombertin to pay over to Betty Fitzgerald the one hundred dollars after which he did the same day
