Wilkinson County. I Ellis Keenill of said State  
County being of advanced age best of bound  
aspiring Mind and Memory knowing that  
much shortly depart this life down th night  
and prosper as regards my self and family  
that I should make a disposition of the pro-  
That a kind Providence has blessed me w  
I do therefore make this my last Will and  
Testament hereby revoking and annuling  
Others heretofore made.

1<sup>st</sup> I desire and direct that my body be  
buried in a decent and Christian like man-  
ner suitable to my condition and Circumstances  
in life My soul I trust shall return to  
God who gave it and I hope for salvation  
through the merits and intercession of the bly  
Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

2<sup>nd</sup> I desire and direct that all my just  
debt be paid by my executors herein after  
named and appointed.

3<sup>rd</sup> I give bequeath and devise unto my  
beloved wife Priscilla my house and  
lot in the Town of Irwinton with all  
my house hold and Kitchen furniture, and  
also one hundred and seventy five acres  
of land being part of lot #58477 in the  
South district of said County with all the crop  
of all kinds that may be on hand with the buggy  
and little wagon and all the stock all the  
named property named in Act 3<sup>rd</sup> is given to my  
beloved wife for and during her life, and that  
the same be managed by my executors with her  
consent for her sole support as circumstances  
may seem to justify.

4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter  
Essey M. Hamill One hundred Dollars to be paid  
to her by my executors as a debt due for her  
parental attention in my last sickness.

5<sup>th</sup> I desire and direct that one half acre of land  
stand around my Mother grave, said land not  
being included in Act 3<sup>rd</sup> as given to my wife  
and now set apart said lot as a family grave  
land forever on which I wish to be buried.

6 Art. The residue of my property, both real and personal, whatever and whatever it may be including that given to my wife in Art 3<sup>rd</sup>. What remains after her estate is gone to be sold and equally divided between my two heirs; and all of said estate that is not disposed of by me in this will, and wish and direct that my executors sell, and divide among my heirs, as soon as it may seem to them most practicable,

7 Art. I hereby appoint and constitute my executors Harrison E. Harrell and Erasmus Bullock, executors of this my last will and testament,
