my death.

Item Third. It is my will and desire that all  
the property of every kind both real and personal  
of every kind that I may acquire and when  
ever it may be situated that I die owning or  
being of my go to and belong to my nephew  
Alexander H. Nestell now of Washington County and  
I hereby bequeath the same to him forever.

Item Fourth. I hereby nominate and appoint  
my nephew Alexander H. Nestell executor of this  
my last will and testament and it is my  
desire that he shall close up my estate without  
any expense of making an appraisement or  
returning what so ever but to take possession of the  
same after my death and pay up my debts  
and mortgage the same as his own so far  
as the law will authorize him to do so.
