3rd I want my houses and lands to remain undisturbed of until my son Lewis J. is twenty one years old, and all that is made on the place after this family is provided for, to be paid on all the notes with my signature to them.

4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Sallie Louisa the bedstead, bed and bedclothes + pillows and bolster in my room and also the folding table.

5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Mamma Corrine the sewing machine.

6th I give and bequeath to my daughter Charlie Edna my bible.

7th The house belonging to me and not otherwise disposed of, I wish to remain on my place to help to support my children, except the buggy, that I give to my husband E. J. M. Callaway.
8th I hereby constitute and appoint my Brother J. J. Whitehurst, Executor of this my last Will and Testament.

1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and condition. My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it, as I hope for eternal salvation through the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, whose religion I have professed and as I humbly trust enjoyed for fifty years.

2nd I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors herein after named as I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed of their rights especially as there is no necessity for delay.

3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Mrs. Margta C. Glenister, my home place, containing 019 1/2 one hundred and nineteen acres more or less, with all the improvements thereon, the same being and lying on the East side of Central Rail. road, also what land I own on the East side of the public road leading from Gordon to Jones County line by Savage Hardies, number of lots not known, my number of acres not known to me, also one horse named Prince and my two horse wagon.

4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Mrs. Mary J. Glenister wife of A. C. Glenister one hundred acres of land part of 0273 1/2 two hundred and seventy three acres more or less adjoining land of J. H. Solomon dec'd the said one hundred acres to be the north part of said tract or parcel of land.

5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Mrs. Malinda J. Whitaker wife of W. J. Whitaker
