right and proper that I should make a distribution
of my property and money as I desire it should
be appropriated after my death.

I desire that all my just debts be paid by my
Executors herein after named.

I give to my beloved wife Elizabeth Vanlandingham
all of my estate to use for her own benefit in any
way that she may see proper during her natural
life or widowhood, except one horse value of which
shall be one hundred and fifty dollars, one cow and
calf and one feather bed and stead and furniture
for Louis Vanlandingham, and one cow and calf
and feather bed and stead and furniture for
W. H. S. Vanlandingham to make them equal with
their other brothers.

I desire that my three sons Jethro D. Vanlandingham
W. H. S. Vanlandingham and Louis Vanlandingham
all to remain on my land and cultivate it if
satisfied to do so, and more especially W. H. S.
Vanlandingham and Louis Vanlandingham to remain
during the natural life of their mother Elizabeth
Vanlandingham.

Hall Jr. as trustee so herein directed to appropriate
the same to the use and benefit of her own
life and the heirs of her own body and no
part whatever to be controlled by her husband.

6th And lastly I herein constitute my three sons
John D. Vanlandingham, William M. S. Vanlandingham
and Louis Vanlandingham, Executors to this my
last will and Testament.
