Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be
paid without delay by my executor hereinafter appointed
as I now unfeignedly expect none should be delayed
in their payment especially as there is no necessity for
delay.

Item I desire that my property all remain together till
my son Wm. C. Anthony becomes twenty one years
of age controlled by my executor. I desire that my
family be well provided for if it takes all the income
I desire that Maria Virginia and Charles Slocom and
Wm. C. Anthony have a good English education I
desire that Emma and Lucy Jane remain
at home with my wife till they marry if they can
agree. If they can't agree I want them supported out
of a part of the income of my plantation but my will is
for them to remain at home while they live single

Item If my son Wm. C. Anthony should die before he
becomes of age then I desire for my property to remain
together till my son Charles Slocom becomes of age
thirty one years of age. I desire that all my children
be of age before there is a division of my property
then they will all be on an equal basis and
educated if the income should increase above a
support of the family and schooling the three youngest
children then give the surplus to the children that is

5th Item When the time comes for a final division give my
beloved wife Martha Ann Holloman one year's
support and three hundred dollars, but should
she take a lover or. Gowenstead her than be her
part but I don't think she will do that. She has
something now of her own.

10th Item I desire than all my children that have had
a bed and furniture and those should have a
horse or one hundred and fifty dollars and one
bed apiece and furniture and then come in equal as
I took no receipt from them that have had for
their bed and horse then make all up even with
the receipts that I have taken from the rest if
there be enough to do it. Then if there is any over
divide it equal with all the children. my will is
for all to be equal if I can have it so.

15th Item I hereby constitute and appoint my son in law
Stephen D. Whipple Executor of this my last will
and testament.
