State of Georgia
New South County

On the fifteenth day
of January in the year of our Lord
one thousand Eight hundred & Twenty seven
personally appeared in open Court before us
Samuel Owens, Jacob Wood, Henry
Gignilhat and Allen B. Powell
Justices of the Superior Court for the County
of New South State aforesaid Solomon Jones
now a resident of said County aged about
sixty six years who being first duly sworn
according to Law doth on his oath make
the following declaration in order to obtain
the provisions made by the Acts of Congress
of the Eighteenth day of March 1818 &
the 1st May 1820. That he the said Solo-
mon Jones was enlisted in the continental
army in the revolutionary war in the year
1776 in the State of Virginia by one An-
drew Giler then a recruiting sergeant in
the continental service and was afterwards
carried from thence to Savannah in the

State of Georgia and served for three years
in the Company commanded by the said
Andrew Gster who was then its captain
in the regiment commanded by Col. Stark
and was then discharged in Charleston South
Carolina by Col. or General McIntosh
he afterwards returned to the State of Georgia
that he shortly after enlisted in the State
of North Carolina in Captain Meligano's
company of militia and from thence with
his obligation with said company on a nine
months tour. That a short time before the
fall of Charleston Colonel William Washing-
ton came to Dozier with his dragoons
and from thence came to Charleston. That
his recruiting sergeants name was Summerton
that he there enlisted in said company of
dragoons under Colonel William Washington
for the remainder of the war & remained
with him until the close of the war
when he was discharged & discharged at
the high hills of Suiter in the State
of South Carolina - That

during the greater part of the time that
deponent served in said dragoons under
Colonel Washington he acted in the capacity
of Principal Major of said dragoons that
he was at the battle of Eutaw Springs in 1781
the lower Penn. That he had his horse shot
from under him in the first battle and
his right arm wounded & splintered in the
last battle. And the deponent further oath
that he thereby relinquishes every claim what
ever to a pension except the present. That
he is now advanced in years has lost the
sight of one eye and from age & infirmity
is now no longer able to support himself
singly without some assistance from his
country. That the following is the reason
why the deponent hath not made an
earlier application for a pension, that he has
several times spoken to professional gentlemen
to make the application for him when he was
actually in need of support & assistance from
his country but not having the means of giving
them a fee the same was neglected. That the present

application on behalf of this defendant is made
by a professional gentleman without fee & reward
that your defendant being ignorant of the form of pro-
ceeding and unlettered was unable himself to make the
application without a prologue which he had not
left a sufficient reason for not negating the evidence
And in pursuance of the act of the 1st May

1820 I do solemnly swear that I was a
resident citizen of the United States on the
18th March 1818 and that I have not since

that time by gift sale or in any manner
disposed of my property or any part thereof
or with intent thereby so to diminish it
as to bring myself within the provisions
of an Act of Congress entitled "An Act
to provide for certain persons engaged in
the Land & Naval service of the United
States in the Revolutionary War passed
the 18th March 1818"; and that I have
not nor has any person in trust for me
any property or securities, contracts or
debts due to me; nor have I any income
other than what is contained in the
