State of Virginia, Mecklenburg County 7th

On the 21st day of September 1818, before the County Court of Mecklenburg personally appeared William Coleman aged 58 years, resident in Mecklenburg County, who being first duly sworn according to Law, on his oath, doth make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the Act of Congress entitled "An Act to provide for certain Persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War": That he the said William Coleman enlisted in Mecklenburg County, State of Virginia, in the Company commanded by Capt. Andrew Peter of the 3rd Regiment in the Georgia line, into the 1st Battalion, that he continued to serve in said corps, in the United States Service, until the 21st of September 1777, when he was discharged from service as a Private in the State of Georgia, that he was in the Battle of Augusta, Savannah, and other places, and that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his Country for support, and that he has no other witnesses in his favor of his said services.

Sworn to and declared before the Court, the day & year Afore said.

I Mark Alexander, preceding Justice of the Peace for the County aforesaid, do certify that it appears to my satisfaction, that the said William Coleman did serve in the Revolutionary War as stated in the preceding declaration, against the common Enemy, for the term of Nine Months, on the continuous establishment. I further certify that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of assistance from

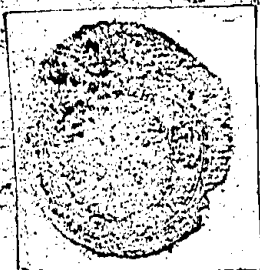
his Country for Support. And I now transmit the
proceedings and Testimony taken and had before the
Court to the Secretary of the War Department pursuant
to the directions of the aforementioned Act of Congress
given under my hand & seal the day & year first
above written

District of Virginia. Mecklenburg County Oct

On this 19th day of July 1821 personally appeared in open court (under a Court of record by and act of assembly and under the County Court of Justice) and common law for the County of Mecklenburg in the District aforesaid; William Coleman, a fifty nine years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in terms of the Revolution in the 2nd Regiment, commanded by Colonel Perison until the death of the said Perison - that the command of the said Regiment then devolved on Ed. Malminday with whom he continued to serve until discharged by Major Cutler in Augusta, Georgia in September 1799 - that he was in the battles at Savannah, Oricr Creek & Stone. His original declaration was on the 21st day of September 1818 and his former certificate under the law of 18th March 1818 issued on the 14th day of December 1818 and numbered 4883 - and I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States of America on the 16th of March 1818 - and that I have not since that time by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof, with intent thereby to diminish it, as to being myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval services of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed the 16th March 1818 and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me - any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me - nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed -

Schedule Twelv.

One hand of Cattle, one Horse, a few plantation tools consisting of an axe or two &c - amounting in value to one hundred dollars.

Dear Madam:

You are furnished below the record of William Coleman as found in the papers on file in pension claim, S. 39337, based upon his service in the Revolution.

The date and place of this soldier's birth and names of his parents are not given.

William Coleman enlisted October 12, 1776, in Mecklenburg County, Virginia, served as private in Captain Andrew Jeter's company, Colonel Screven's 3rd Georgia Regiment, and in Colonel Malmody's regiment, was in the battles of Augusta, Brier Creek, Stono and Savannah, and was discharged September 27, 1779.

William Coleman was allowed pension on his application executed September 21, 1818, at which time he was a resident of Mecklenburg County, Virginia, and stated that he was aged fifty-eight years. In 1821 he was still residing in Mecklenburg County and then gave his age as fifty-nine years, with no explanation of the discrepancy.

It is not stated whether the soldier ever married.

In order to obtain date of last payment of pension, the name and address of the person paid and possibly the date of death of this soldier, you should write to the Comptroller General, General Accounting Office, Records Division, this city, and cite the following data: William Coleman, Certificate #4833, issued December 14, 1818, rate \$8 per month, commenced September 21, 1818, Act March 18, 1818, Virginia Agency.
