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(24) Declaration was given to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress of the 7th March 1832—

State of Georgia On the the fourteenth day of January 1832 Joseph B. in the year eighteen hundred and thirty three personally appeared in open Court before the Honorable Justices of the Superior Court of said County now sitting John Tinsley and a Justice of the County of Joseph said State aforesaid aged seventy four years the 15th of November last past, who being duly sworn according to law doth in his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed 7th March 1832

That he entered the Service of the United States in the State of South Carolina as a drafted Militia man & served a two month tour at Furberburgh under Capt. Cantraw & Col. Cashaw. Said Marion being then having the Command. This applicant further states that he was afterwards served a two month tour of duty at Camden under Captain Terrell and Col. Marshall, of two months or more each, said Marion still having Command. & that he also served a tour of duty at the place called the Four holes in South Carolina, Commanded by Genl. Marion & Genl. Sumpter. When Col. Blalock was in Command of the Regiment & Capt. Davis of the Company in which applicant served. & that he served likewise in a number of short tours from the beginning to the end of the war in scouting parties after the Forces of British.

This applicant states that he cannot recollect the precise time at which these services were commenced, or when ended, only that that they were done during the War, having never received any written Memorandum from his officers, & if so, that they have been long since lost or misplaced - The known of no one who can testify to his services in full.

The applicant believes that his services amount on all over the term of two years, & that he served under the Capacity of a Common Soldier, having never held a Commission, or higher Commission than Sergeant -

He hereby relinquishes every claim to pension or bounty except the present & declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any State whatever. GAF

Given in ^{GA} the County of ^{Franklin} on the twenty fourth day of June 1833 before
me the undersigned Judge of the Inferior Court of said County, John Sunderland
a resident of the County & State aforesaid who being duly sworn
according to Law did on his oath make the following
affidavit to his declaration to the effect that on the
fourteenth day of January 1833 he did receive the
benefit of the act of Congress passed the 7th June 1832

That it is impossible for him now to state the precise
period at which he entered the service of the United
States as he has no means at hand or within his reach
to ascertain the time exactly.

The applicant further states that by reason of old
age & the ever great loss of memory he cannot more
precisely as to the precise length of his service but
according to the best of his recollection he served
not less than the period mentioned below & on the following
grades. For ten months I served as a private under
the command of Capt. Cummings & Col. Graham. For four
months I served ^{in the} under the command of Lt. Col. & Col.

The laws provided that the free holds in South Carolina I should
as a private soldier the command of Capt. Davis & Col. Stephens
for five months as Volunteer Infantry under the command
of Capt. Deason & Major McManis (the last tour of five
months was not mentioned in the original declaration of
which this is a supplementary for such service I claim as
private.

This applicant further states that his recollection of
the length of time he served in the number of about,
times of duty mentioned in his original declaration
against the United States is too indistinct for him
to swear about. He had rather lose any pension
for it.

This applicant further answers to the several
writing orders directed by the War Department to be
performed by the Court as follows

To the 1st I was born in North Carolina near
New River (having been taken from there as a young
child) I do not recollect the County - I was born the
15th Nov 1838.

2 I have the record of my age at my residence in
the County.

3 I have been in North Carolina - I moved
from Lancaster to Chester & from Chester to Cayfield
& from Cayfield back to Lancaster, from there
to Chesterfield, from there to Jones County.

Georgia from thence to Monroe County before thence to Monroe
County where I now live -

4th I was drafted every time except the times under
Capt. Quisenberry & Major Morris. In that I volunteered

5th Gov. James was with the troops in which I served
at Camden S. Carolina. & the circumstances of
my service are stated in my original declaration

6th I received one discharge & that from Capt.
Turner under Gov. Marion, but the same has
been lost.

7th I would mention the name of Mr. Wm.
Whitfield & John W. Henderson who have attested
to a certificate to that effect in
my original Declaration -

Under the act of the 6th of April, 1838, entitled "An Act directing the transfer of money remaining unclaimed by certain Pensioners, and authorizing the payment of the same at the Treasury of the United States," and the 3d section of the Act of August 23, 1842, extending the time within which pensioners may receive their pensions from the pension agents, John Funderburk,

a Pensioner on the Roll of the Georgia Agency, at the rate of Twenty Six — Dollars and 66 Cents per annum, under the law of the 7th June 1802, has been paid at this Department, from the 4th of March 1840, to the 4th Sept. 1841.
