DANIEL GRANT, b. Va., 1724; d. Wilkes Co., Ga. 1793 (will dated July 4, 1793). Removed to N. C. 1765. Served with N. C. troops; received bounty grant of land in Ga. for his service. Mar. 1750, ELIZABETH TAIT.

JAMES GRAVES, b. Culpeper Co., Va., 1730; d. Lincoln Co., Ga., 1796. Mar. 1750, MARY COPELAND, b. Va., about 1732; d. Lincoln Co., Ga., 1801. He served as a *Rev. Sol.* of Ga., private, under Gen. Elijah Clarke, at the Battle of Kettle Creek. Certificate of Gen. Clarke, April 9, 1784; received 287½ acres of land in Franklin Co., Ga., bounded N. W. by land given by Ga. to COUNT DE ESTAING, *Rev. Sol.* from France.

JOHN GRAVES, b. Culpeper Co., Va., 1748; d. Wilkes Co., Ga., 1824. A *Rev. Sol.* Was at Brandywine, Germantown, and Monmouth. When Gen. Greene crossed the Yadkin river in 1780, Col. Graves was ordered to protect the Troops from Cornwallis; received bounty grant of land in Ga. Settled near Graves Mt. (named for him); moved to a place named French Mills, in Wilkes (now Lincoln) Co., Ga., where he d.; buried in family graveyard at the home of his son. Mar. Catherine West. Had issue.

WILLIAM GRAVES, b. 1746; d. Ala., 1802.; received land in Ga. for his service; moved later to Ala. Mar. SARAH SMITH. Their dau.:

Dorothy Graves, mar. as (1) wife, Bird Fitzpatrick (son of WILLIAM FITZPATRICK (1746-1809), who received bounty grant of land in Ga. for his service); lived in Savannah, Ga., and his wife, Anne Philips (dau. of JOSEPH PHILIPS, *Rev. Sol.* of Ga., who served under Col. Elijah Clarke (1734-1800) in Ga., and his wife, Sarah Lyndes (Lindes)).

HENRY GRAYBILL, b. Lancaster Co., Penn., 1734; d. Washington Co., Ga., 1816. Served as private, Ga. Line, under Gen. Elijah Clarke; received bounty land in Ga. for his service. Mar. MARY RUTHERFORD.

JOHN GREEN, his claims as a *Rev. Sol.* paid to him Jan. 27, 1784, then Sheriff of Effingham Co. Mar. MARTHA REBECCA —. He d. Effingham Co., Ga., 1819, age 55 years. Served as Capt., 6th Co. Batt., Continental Army of Ga.

McKEEN GREEN, JR. (son of McKEEN GREEN, SR., *Rev. Sol.* of Ga.), d. Tattnall Co., Ga. On certificate of Col. Caleb Powell, he received bounty grant of land on the Altamaha river, Washington Co., Ga., for his service as a *Rev. Sol.*, June 9, 1784. Mar. at Ogeechee, Ga., July 3, 1786, Elinor McCall (dau. of CHARLES McCALL, *Rev. Sol.* of S. C. and Ga., and grand-dau. of FRANCIS McCALL, *Rev. Sol.* of N. C.).

PETER GREENE, JR., b. R. I., 1725; d. Hancock Co., Ga., Oct. 20, 1807. Lived in Brunswick Co., Va. during the Rev. and served as a *Rev. Sol.* of Va. as private. Mar. 1750, Judith Love (dau. of Allen Love). She was b. Oct. 1727; d. Hancock Co., Ga.

MAJOR GEN. NATHANIEL GREENE, b. Warwick, R. I., May 27, 1741; d. at his plantat home, "Mulberry Grove," in Ga., June 9, 1786. (Plantation presented to him for his *Rev. serv* by the State of Ga.; formerly the confiscated estate of Lieut. Gov. of Ga., John Graham, 14 miles fr Savannah, Ga.) He served as Col., was made Major Gen. by act of Legislature and in 1783 was vo a resolution of thanks for his service by the Congress of the United States. Monument erected his memory, Savannah, Ga. Inscribed on monument: "Major Gen. Nathaniel Greene. Sold patriot, and friend of GEN. GEORGE WASHINGTON, *Rev. Sol.* and later *President of United States.*" Mar. July 20, 1774, CATHERINE LITTLEFIELD. She mar. (2) at Philadelpl Penn., 1796, Phineas Miller.

WILLIAM GREENE, SR., b. Va., 1734; removed to Warren Co., N. C. Mar. there, SAR/ ANN ALSTON. Served in 1st N. C. Regiment as Captain; was granted 500 acres bounty land an officer for service in Washington Co., Ga., Jan. 24, 1784.

WILLIAM GREENE, JR., b. N. C., 1764; d. Greene Co., Ga., Dec. 13, 1819. Will on reco: made Dec. 8, 1819. Served as private in N. C. and Ga. Militia; of the First Batt. Richmond Co., G Militia; received 287½ acres of bounty land for his service in Greene Co., upon certificate of Gt Elijah Clarke, 1785. He was also a *Sol. of the War of 1812* from Greene Co., Ga. Mar. June 17, 17 RUTH HUNTER, b. Warren Co., N. C., Sept. 24, 1764; d. Greene Co., Ga., May 15, 1826 (dau. JESSE HUNTER, *Rev. Sol.* of N.
