They call to mind, with satisfaction, only equalled by their sorrow, the virtues of his benevolent Heart—his strict integrity—his unflinching manners—and his acquirements as a Lawyer and a Scholar; They are sensible, that in all of these, he might justly have been deemed an Example, worthy of imitation, and they feel, with how much severity, death hath deprived the Bar, of an Ornament—his friends, of an endearing comfort, & Society of worth seldom equalled, and never surpassed.
