REGIMENTAL ORDERS.

IN pursuance of General Orders from the
Commander in Chief, dated Head Quar-
ters, 24th January, 1845, all the troops
composing the 2d Regiment of Georgia
Cavalry, will hold themselves in readiness
to rendezvous at a moment's warning, at
such places as may hereafter be pointed
out, completely equipped, to act as Dragoons
or Mounted Infantry, as the occasion may
require. The Captains will be permitted
to fill their troops from the 2d and 3d
classes of the militia, and such as cannot
be equipped as Cavalry will provide themselves
with a good firelock for actual service.
Commanding officers of troops ordered
to make correct returns of the present state
of their respective corps to the adjutant
without delay.
