(GS) On this 21st day of November 1853, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace, within and for the County and State aforesaid, Suckey Haver aged sixty years, a resident of the County and State aforesaid, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of William Haver, who served in the company commanded by John E. Little in the ^{regiment} Militia commanded by — under General Floyd in the war with the Creek Indians in the year 1812, believed to have been mustered into service at Fort Hawkins, Georgia, and continued in active service in said war for at least fourteen days and was honorably discharged at Fort Hawkins or Milledgeville, Georgia, on the — day of 1812. Said discharge forwarded to Washington City, upon a former application for ^{a warrant for} 80 acres of land. (GAR)

She further states that she was married to the said Wm Haver in Georgia on the — day of May 1817 and that her name before her said marriage was Suckey Kerr that her said husband died in St Clair ¹⁸⁴¹ County Alabama on the 20th day of August 1840 and that she is now a widow.

She further declares that she has heretofore made application for bounty land under the act approved September 28, 1850, (to which she now refers www.georgiapioneers.com)

has legally disposed of, and cannot now return it.

She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the additional bounty land to which she may be entitled under act of March 3rd, 1855, never having received or applied for bounty land under this or any other act of Congress except as above stated.

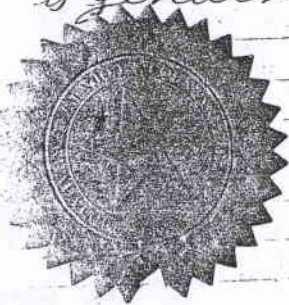

I received, some months ago, in relation to the application of Mrs Lukey Haver (widow of Tom Haver) for bounty land under the act of March 3, 1835, (No. of application 229,396) Circular T. Saying it "was suspended on account of dissimilarity in the signature, and that an explanation under oath is required," (GW)

The signature alluded to, was not Mrs Lukey Haver's, but her daughters. The old lady not being present when the additional evidence was prepared.

"An explanation under oath is required." Would an oath that Mrs Lukey Haver was not the person who signed the last affidavit be sufficient? If not, please let me know what evidence would be sufficient; It will be impossible to furnish positive evidence of the marriage, as the witnesses are dead, whose places of residence are not known, W. that she is the widow of William Faver deceased
who was a private in the company commanded
by Captain John Little in the Regiment of Militia commanded
by Brig. Gen. John Floyd in the war with Great Britain declared
by the United States on the 18th of June 1812 that her hus-
band the said William Faver was drafted at Wilkes County in the
State of Georgia on or about the twenty fifth day of August A.D. 1813
for the term of six months as it continued in actual
service in said war for the term of six months ~~and~~ and was
honorably discharged after the expiration of the term for which he
was drafted on the third day of March in the year
1814 as will appear by his original Certificate of discharge
herewith presented ~~and~~ and by the Muster Roll of said Company

She further states that she was married to the said William
Faver in the State of Georgia on the third day of May 1817
by one Richard Stoggett a Justice of the Peace in and for said County & State
that her name before said marriage was Suskey Flett
that her said husband died at the County of St. Clair in the State
of Alabama on the 20th day of August 1841
and she is still a widow

may be entitled under the act of Congress passed September 18th 1850
