On this 22nd day of March, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, personally appeared before me, James H. Shook, Clerk of the Superior Court, the same being a court of record within and for the county and State aforesaid, (1) William B. Hill (GAR), aged eighty-one years, a resident of Pennington District the county of Monroe, in the State of Georgia, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical (2) William B. Hill who served under the name of (3) William B. Hill as a (4) Private the company commanded by Captain Washington Rogers in the 1st regiment Georgia Volunteers, commanded by Col. W. H. Walker, the war of (5) 1812; that he (6) was discharged at Linton, Jones County, Georgia on or about the 18th day of August, A. D. 1815, for the term of three years, and continued in actual service in said war for the term of (7) sixteen days, and was engaged in the Battle of Milledgeville, and was honorably discharged at Washington, Georgia the 18th day of August, A. D. 1815.

That since his discharge from said service he has resided as follows, viz: (8) About eight years in Jones Co. Ga. and fifty five years in Monroe County Georgia
he following was his description at the time of his enlistment, viz: (9) His face was rich high - thick hair - brown eyes, and rather dark complexion

He makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the pension to which he may be entitled under section 4736 to 4740, inclusive, Revised Statutes, and the act of March 9, 1878, and hereby appoints Samuel T. Miles of Washington, D. C. his lawful Attorney to prosecute his claim.
