Marriage. { Date Decr 19<sup>th</sup> 1815, of John H Phillips to  
Mary A Lane. Shown by Certified copy of marriage  
record of Jasper Co Ga of William Thornton Abner Jester  
and Green Thornton who know the parties lived together as  
husband and wife to date of soldier's death

Proof as to capacity  
to marry. { Neither claimant or soldier married before  
alleged by clmt

Death of soldier. { Date April 8<sup>th</sup> 1871 Alleged by soldier's son John S Phillips  
under oath, Corroborated (the fact of death) by Wm and G Thornton  
and Abner Jester and by allegation of clmt.

Widowhood. { Shown by testimony of the son and of the other witnesses  
named above

Claimant and soldier in their respective declarations state that  
soldier enlisted in Jasper Co Ga. Clmt alleges that the parties lived  
in Jasper Co Ga after their marriage, and in Monroe until 1849  
when they moved to Butler Co which named Co the soldier made

seem to be made in some way  
In a half dozen cases I have had  
40 acre warrants sent me and upon  
returning them without any  
amendment of declaration or addi-  
tional evidence submitted Eighty acre  
warrants have been sent me in their  
stead. Of time and perplexity in  
issuing warrants are estimated this  
man is certainly entitled to  
80 acres - for he has been ever since  
the passage of the act striving to obtain  
his warrant. Please examine this  
warrant and the declaration and send  
me 80 acres in it's stead
