. There will be five Eclipses this year, three of the Sun and two of the Moon.

I. There will be an Eclipse of the Moon on the 31st of May in the evening, of which a small fragment only will be seen here, the Moon will rise (1 62 digits eclipsed) at 7h. 27m. and the Eclipse will end at 7h. 35m.

II. There will be an eclipse of the Sun on the 15th of June, at 7h. 30m. in the evening, invisible here, visible in the South Pacific and Great Southern Oceans.

III. There will be an eclipse of the Sun on the 10th of November, at 4h. 40m. in the morning, invisible. Visible only in a small portion of the Great Southern Ocean.

IV. There will be an eclipse of the Moon on Sunday, November 24th, in the evening, visible and total.

ABSTRACT OF THE INSOLVENT LAW OF MASS. 1838.

1. The law provides that any debtor, whose debts amount to \$200, may apply to the judge of probate, or any master of chancery, setting forth his inability to pay his debts, and willingness to assign all his property for that purpose.

2. Upon such application, the judge is required to appoint a messenger to take possession of the debtor's estate, real and personal, except such as by law is exempted (see Revised Statutes) from attachment, and keep until assignees be appointed.

3. No property to be delivered until a meeting of the creditors to choose assignees.

4. The judge is to attend such meeting, and allow such claims as shall then be proved; the creditors to choose assignees, but if they are unable, by the judge.

5. The judge shall convey to the assignees all the estate of the debtor, except that exempted by law, with his deeds, books, and papers relating thereto. Attachments or assignments are void after the first publication of notice by the messenger.

6. The debtor is to make oath relating to the disposal of his estate, and all debts due him.

7. The debtor shall be allowed a sum for the support of himself and family, for two months, not exceeding the rate of three dollars per week for each member, as he may think proper.

8. Within three months another meeting of the creditors is to be held, and those who have not proved their claims, may do so. The debtor on making oath that he has delivered the messenger and assignees all his estate, of what kind soever, the judge, being satisfied, shall grant him a discharge.

9. But if one half in number or in value of the creditors, not less than \$50, shall object to his discharge, it shall not be granted, unless by the S. Judicial Court, on appeal.

10. Every debtor so discharged shall be allowed 5 per cent. on the net produce of all his estate, in case such net produce shall be sufficient to pay his creditors the amount of 50 per cent., not exceeding in the whole \$500.

11. When the debtor is either unable or unwilling to pay his just debts in full, he may be compelled to assign his property, if indebted to the amount of \$100 to one creditor.

Her citizens have nearly \$12,000,000 invested in the fisheries, which is more than twice as much as all the rest of the Union.

To know how many members of the House any State is entitled to, subtract two (for Senators,) from its quota of Electors above, and the remainder will be the number of its Representatives.

The apportionment bill of 1842 allows one member for 70,680 of population, and a representative for each fraction over one half the ratio. This will give a House of Representatives of 223 members, instead of 242, the present number.

The Convention of the Congregational Ministers in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts

Is a voluntary Association embracing all the Congregational Clergy of the Commonwealth, but vested with no particular authority or control over the Churches.

Their meeting is held in Boston, on the last Wednesday in May, annually, at five o'clock, P. M. and the following day. After transacting the usual business of the Convention, a sermon is delivered in public before them, and a collection made for the charitable purpose of relieving the indigent Widows of Congregational clergymen.

Rev. Nehemiah Adams, of Boston, Scribe of the Convention.

Rev. Samuel K. Lothrop, of Boston, Treasurer.

Rev. Daniel Dana, D. D. of Newburyport, 1st Preacher.

Rev. Mark Hopkins, D. D. of Williamstown, 2d Preacher.

For the purpose of investigating cases of necessity, and of application for the charity of the Convention, there are two standing Committees; a Central Committee, chosen centrally, and a Reporting Committee, whose members reside in different parts of the State. The Reporting Committee are required, each year, to investigate the circumstances of the objects of this charity, whether already on the list, or needing, or applying the first time for aid, and make a particular statement to the Central Committee, directed to the Scribe of the Convention, at least one week before the meeting of the Convention. Should any member neglect so to do for two successive years, his place in the Reporting Committee shall be vacated. The Central Committee receive from the members of the Reporting Committee applications and statements of facts in behalf of subjects of the charity of the Convention, and, having considered the same, are to judge of the persons to be relieved, and the proportion to be given to each, and make report to the Convention, on the first day of their meeting, annually.

The statements of the members of the Reporting Committee are expected to contain answers to the following questions—

1. What is her age?
2. What are the number, the sex, the ages, and the circumstances of their children?
3. What is a fair estimate of her property?
4. What is her ability to help herself?
5. What connexions has she, who are bound to afford her assistance? And in what way do they assist her?
6. What is her income?
7. What peculiar circumstances render her an object of charity; or make it desirable that she should have aid this year?

BRITISH AND AMERICAN TRADE.

The amount in value of exports from Great Britain to the United States has been extremely variable, having risen in 1836 to £12,425,605, and fallen in the next year to £4,695,225. The amount, or rather the value, was smallest in 1842, viz. £3,528,807, having been, in 1832, more than double, viz. £7,579,699. The greatest falling off was in cotton and woollen manufactures, the amount of the former having been in 1832, £1,733,047, and in 1842, only £487,276; and of the latter, in 1832, £2,289,883, and in 1842, £892,335. In one other article, however, the proportion of diminution was still greater than that of woollen goods, viz. the silk manufacture. The value of silk goods exported to the United States in 1832, was £251,278, and in 1842, only £81,243. In the imports in the mean time, as well as in the tonnage of both nations, there was an increase. The amount of cotton imported in 1833, was 237,506,758 lbs., and in 1842, 414,030,779 lbs. Tobacco in 1833, 20,748,317 lbs.; in 1842, 38,618,012 lbs.

The regular army consists of 716 commissioned officers, 17 military storekeepers, and 7590 enlisted men, (non-commissioned officers, artificers, musicians and privates, of dragoons, artillery, infantry, and riflemen,) 40 sergeants and 250 enlisted men of ordnance, making an aggregate of 8613, organized as follows:—

General and Staff Officers—One Major General; two Brigadier Generals; one Adjutant General; six Assistant Adjutants General; two Inspectors General; one Quartermaster General; two Deputy Quartermasters General; four Quartermasters and twenty-eight Assistant Quartermasters; one Commissary General, one Assistant Commissary General, and six Commissaries of Subsistence.

Medical Department—One Surgeon General, twenty Surgeons and fifty Assistant Surgeons.

Pay Department—One Paymaster General and fifteen Paymasters.

Corps of Engineers—One Colonel, two Lieutenant Colonels, four Majors, twelve Captains, twelve First Lieutenants, and fifteen Second Lieutenants.

Corps of Topographical Engineers—One Colonel, one Lieutenant Colonel, four Majors, ten Captains, ten First Lieutenants, and twelve Second Lieutenants.

Ordnance Corps—One Colonel, one Lieutenant Colonel, four Majors, ten Captains, six First Lieutenants, and eleven Second Lieutenants.

One Regiment of Dragoons, containing ten companies of fifty privates each; *Four Regiments of Artillery*, each containing ten companies of forty-two privates; *Eight Regiments of Infantry*, each containing ten companies of forty-two privates; *One Regiment of Riflemen*, of ten companies of fifty privates each.

The United States are divided into nine military departments, commanded each by a General Officer or Colonel.

The *1st Military Department*, commanded by Brevet Brigadier General Arbuckle, embraces West Florida, Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, Tennessee and Kentucky; head quarters, New Orleans.

The *2d Military Department*, commanded by Brevet Brigadier General Taylor, embraces the country west of the Mississippi, north of Louisiana and Texas, and

south of the 37th degree of north latitude ; head-quarters, Fort Smith. It contains four garrisoned posts.

The *3d Military Department*, commanded by Brevet Major General Gaines, (temporarily by Colonel Kearney, Dragoons) embraces the State of Missouri, (above the 37th degree of north latitude,) Illinois, Iowa, that part of Wisconsin Territory west of the 13th degree of longitude west of Washington, and the Indian country north and west of the lines indicated.

The *4th Military Department*, commanded by Brevet Brigadier General Brady ; head quarters, Detroit, embraces the States of Indiana, Ohio and Michigan ; the part of Wisconsin Territory not included in the 3d Department, and the Indian country north.

The *5th Military Department*, commanded by Brigadier General Wool, head quarters at Troy, embraces the States of Pennsylvania, New York, Vermont, New Jersey, Connecticut and Rhode Island.

The *6th Military Department*, commanded by Colonel Crane, 1st Artillery, head quarters at Portsmouth, New Hampshire, embraces the State of Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Maine.

The *7th Military Department*, commanded by Colonel Walbach, 4th Artillery, head quarters Fort Monroe, Virginia, embraces the States of Delaware, Maryland and Virginia.

The *8th Military Department*, commanded by Brevet Brigadier General Armistead, head quarters Fort Moultrie, Charleston harbor, embraces the States of North and South Carolina, and Georgia.

The *9th Military Department*, commanded by Brevet Brigadier General Worth, head quarters St. Augustine, embraces East and Middle Florida.

Articles to be admitted duty free.

1. All articles imported for the use of the United States.
2. All goods, the product of the United States, exported and brought back, and books and personal and household effects of citizens of the United States dying abroad.
3. Paintings and statuary, the production of American artists residing abroad.
4. Wearing apparel in actual use, and other personal effects, and tools of trade, of persons arriving in the United States.
5. Philosophical apparatus, instruments, books, maps, and charts, statues, statuary, busts and casts, paintings, drawings, engravings, etchings, specimens of sculpture, cabinets of coin, medals, gems, and all other collections of antiquities, provided the same be specially imported in good faith for the use (and by the order) of any Society incorporated or established for philosophical or literary purposes, or for the use and by the order of any college, academy, school, or seminary of learning in the United States.
6. Anatomical preparations, models of machinery, and of other inventions and improvements in the arts; specimens in natural history, mineralogy, and botany; trees, shrubs, plants, bulbs or roots, and garden seeds, not otherwise specified; berries, nuts, and vegetables, used principally in dyeing or composing dyes; all dyewoods in stick; whale and other fish oil of American fisheries, and all other articles the produce of said fisheries; animals imported for breed; fish, fresh caught, imported for daily consumption; fruit, green or ripe, from the West Indies, in bulk; tea and coffee, when imported in American vessels from the places of their growth.
7. Adhesive felt for sheathing vessels, alcornoque, aloes, antimony crude, argol, assafœtida, ava root, barilla, bark of cork tree, unmanufactured; bells or bell metal, only fit to be remanufactured, and chimes of bells; brass in pigs or bars, and old brass only fit to be remanufactured; Brazil wood, crude brimstone, and flour of sulphur, bullion, hurr stones unwrought; cantharides, chalk, clay unwrought; cochineal, coins of gold and silver, copper for the use of the mint, copper in pigs or bars, and copper ore; plates or sheets of copper for sheathing vessels, but none is to be so considered except that which is 14 inches wide and 48 inches long, and weighing from 14 to 34 oz. per square foot; old copper fit only to be remanufactured; cream of tartar, emery, flints, ground flint, gold bullion, gold epaulets and wings, grindstones, gum Arabic, gum Senegal, gum tragacanth, In-

dia rubber, in bottles or sheets, or otherwise, unmanufactured, and old junk, oakum, kelp, kermes, lac dye, leeches, madder root, mother of pearl, nickel, nux vomica, palm leaf unmanufactured, palm oil; Peruvian bark, pewter when old and only fit to be remanufactured; platina unmanufactured, ivory unmanufactured; plaster of Paris unground, rattans and reeds unmanufactured, rhubarb, saltpetre when crude, sarsaparilla, shellac, silver bullion, silver epaulets and wings, stones called polishing stones, stone called rotten stone, sumac, tartar when crude, teuteneque, tumeric, weld, woods of all kinds, when unmanufactured, not herein enumerated.

The above duties are imposed by the first nine sections of the law.

Section 10, enacts that on all unenumerated articles shall be imposed a duty of 20 per cent. ad valorem.

Sec. 11. An additional 10 per cent. shall be levied on all goods which shall be imported in vessels not of the United States, when no specific discrimination is made by the bill; and 10 per cent. additional on all goods except those brought from beyond the Cape of Good Hope in foreign vessels provided no treaty speculations be infringed thereby.

Sec. 12. All duties shall be paid in cash, or the goods will be sold after 60 days' detention.

Sec. 13 prescribes the method of selling, and means for the owner to recover the overplus.

Sec. 14 allows a drawback on foreign sugar refined in and exported from the United States, equal in amount to the duty paid on the foreign sugar; of 5 cents per gallon on spirits distilled from molasses till 1843, when it shall be only 4, and annually reduced 1 cent.

Sec. 15 enacts that no drawback shall be allowed to goods entitled to debenture unless exported within three years after their import.

Sec. 16 provides the mode of valuation of all goods paying ad valorem duties, enacting that all costs, charges and commissions except insurance shall be added to the market value.

Sec. 17 empowers collectors and appraisers to take testimony necessary for valuation.

Sec. 18 provides for cases of disagreement on appraisal.

Sec. 19 enacts penalties for attempts to evade the payment of duties.

Sec. 20 imposes on non-enumerated articles the same duties as those enumerated which they most resemble shall pay.

Sec. 21 dictates the method of appraisal.

Sec. 22 provides for ports where there are no appraisers.

Sec. 23 directs the Secretary of the Treasury to make necessary rules for faithful appraisals.

Sec. 24 directs collectors to follow the Secretary's instructions.

Sec. 25 provides that the act shall not apply to vessels that shall have left their last port East of the Cape of Good Hope or beyond Cape Horn, prior to Sept. 1, 1842.

Sec. 26 provides that the penalties of the law of June 30, 1842, shall be continued.

Sec. 27 requires the Secretary annually to ascertain and report what articles have paid a duty of more than 35 per cent. ad valorem.

Sec. 28 prohibits the importation of indecent prints and books.

Sec. 29 establishes a ton at twenty hundred weight, at one hundred and twelve lbs. each.

Sec. 30. This Section is added, enacting that while the Distribution of the Public Lands is suspended, the ten per cent. allowed to the Western States shall also be suspended.

In 1842, 1,510,111 tons of American and 732,775 tons of foreign shipping entered, and 1,536,454 tons foreign shipping cleared, in the United States. The

whole number of vessels that entered was 11,474, of which 6,939 were American, employing 69,597 men and 2,913 boys, and 4,535 foreign, employing 42,474 men and 377 boys. Of the foreign vessels, 4,052 were British; 56 French; 65 Spanish; 139 Hanseatic; 6 Russian; 4 Prussian; 1 Austrian; 15 Belgian; 1 Hanoverian; 65 Swedish; 13 Norwegian; 30 Danish; 19 Dutch; 3 Portuguese; 17 Sicilian; 2 Neapolitan; 6 Sardinian; 1 Haytien; 10 Texan; 2 Mexican; 4 Columbian; 22 Venezuelan; 1 New Grenadian, and 1 Brazilian.

DR. HERSCHEL'S TABLE

*For Foretelling the Weather, through all the Lunations
of each Year, forever,—amended by*

DR. ADAM CLARKE.

This table and the accompanying remarks are the result of many years' actual observation ; the whole being constructed on a due consideration of the attraction of the sun and moon, in their several positions respecting the earth, and will, by simple inspection, show the observer what kind of weather will most probably follow the entrance of the moon into any of its quarters, and that so near the truth as to be seldom or never found to fail.

Observations.—1. The nearer the time of the moon's change, first quarter, full and last quarter, are to *midnight*, the fairer will the weather be during the seven days following.

2. The space for this calculation occupies from ten at night till two next morning.

3. The nearer to *mid-day* or *noon*, the phases of the moon happen, the more foul or wet weather may be expected during the next seven days.

4. The space for this calculation occupies from ten in the forenoon to two in the afternoon. These observations refer principally to the summer, though they affect spring and autumn nearly in the same ratio.

5. The moon's change, first quarter, full, and last quarter, happening during six of the afternoon hours, i. e. from four to ten, may be followed by fair weather ; but this is mostly dependent on the *wind*, as is noted in the table.

6. Though the weather, from a variety of irregular causes, is more uncertain in the latter part of autumn, the whole of winter, and the beginning of spring, yet, in the main, the above observations will apply to those periods also.

" An evening red and morning gray,
Will set the traveller on his way ;
But an evening gray and a morning red,
