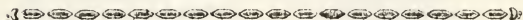

There is "a meeting of the Censors, in the town of Boston, for the examination of candidates for the practice of medicine, surgery and midwifery, on the Thursday next preceding the annual meeting of the Fellows of the Society; and on the day following the meeting of the Counsellors in October and February annually."

The 6th section of the By-Laws contains the following regulation.

"To promote the laudable design of the Legislature, in forming and incorporating this Society, to discourage empiricism, and to prevent, as far as may be, all unqualified persons from practising medicine or surgery; it shall be deemed disreputable, and shall be unlawful, for any Fellow of this Society, in the capacity of physician or surgeon, to advise or consult with any person, who shall hereafter commence the practice of medicine or surgery in this Commonwealth, unless he shall possess either one, or the other of the following qualifications.

"He shall have been duly examined and approbated by the Censors of the Society, or by those of some district Society; or shall have received a medical degree at Harvard University.

"Or should he have been educated in, or come from, some other state or foreign country, unless he shall have produced to the Censors of the Society, or those for the district, wherein he resides, satisfactory evidence of his qualifications for the practice of medicine or surgery."

"Or unless he shall be a Fellow of the Society, and shall not have been expelled therefrom."

§ 7. Pews and Rights in Houses of Public Worship are deemed in law to be real Estate, except in Boston, where they are to be considered as Personal Estate.

*The Convention of the Congregational Ministers in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts*

IS a voluntary Association, embracing all the Congregational Clergy of the Commonwealth, but vested with no particular authority or control over the Churches.

Their meeting is holden in Boston, in the afternoon of the last Wednesday in May, or day of Election annually; and the following day at eleven, A.M. after transacting the usual business of the Convention, a sermon is delivered in Public before them, and a collection made for the charitable purpose of relieving the indigent widows of Congregational Clergymen.

Difficulties having often arisen in determining, what widows are the proper objects of the charity of this Convention, it was voted, June 1, 1815,—That a standing Committee of 30 be appointed, 5 of whom shall be





chosen centrally ; and the remainder in different parts of the State. The five shall act as a *Reporting Committee*, to receive from the other members of the Committee applications and statements of facts in behalf of persons who may be subjects of the charity of the Convention, and having considered the same, shall judge of the persons to be relieved, and the proportion to be given to each, and make report to the Convention, on the 1st day of their meeting, annually ; further, that the names of said Committee shall be annually published in the Massachusetts Register.

Accordingly, when the widow of any Congregational Clergyman is considered an object of the charity of the Convention, it is desired, that answers to the following questions be given by one of the Standing Committee, by the first of May in each year, to be communicated to the Reporting Committee, that they may possess the



documents for making the correct report to the Convention.

1. What is her age.
2. What are the number, the sex, the ages, and the circumstances of her children?
3. What is a fair estimate of her property?
4. What is her ability to help herself?
5. What connexions has she, who are bound to afford her assistance? And in what way do they assist her?
6. What is her income?
7. What peculiar circumstances render her an object of charity; or make it desirable, that she should have aid, this year?

The Rev. Henry Ware, D.D. of Cambridge, is chosen to deliver the next Convention Sermon. In case of failure, Rev. Abiel Holmes, D.D. of Cambridge, will officiate in his stead.

The Convention earnestly recommend to all young gentlemen who design to devote themselves to the work of the ministry, to spend that portion of time in the study of divinity which learned and judicious advisers shall think necessary to qualify them for public teachers.

*The General Association in Massachusetts.*

THIS body was organized in June, 1805. In 1814, it consisted of Delegates from 12 Associations in Massachusetts Proper. Its members "admit, as articles of faith, the doctrines of Christianity, as they are generally expressed in the Assembly's Shorter Catechism," and consider these doctrines, which have been generally embraced by the Churches of New-England, as the "*basis of their Union.*" This body wholly disclaims ecclesiastical power or authority over the Churches, or the opinions of individuals. The essential objects, as expressed in their Constitution, are "to promote brotherly inter-course and harmony, and their mutual animation, assistance and usefulness as ministers of Christ; to obtain religious information relative to the state of their particular churches, and of the general state of the Christian Church in this country and throughout the



Christian world; and to co-operate with other similar institutions in the most eligible measures for building up the cause of truth and holiness."

This Association sends Delegates to, and receives Delegates from, the following ecclesiastical bodies, viz. The General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in the United States. The General Associations of Connecticut and New-Hampshire. And the General Convention of Vermont.

## Government, &c. of each State in the Union.

### NEW-HAMPSHIRE.

The executive power is vested in a Governor and Council. The Governor is chosen by the people annually. If there is no choice, the Legislature fill the vacancy, from the two highest candidates. The Council consists of five persons chosen by the people. The Legislature is styled the General Court. Each branch has a negative on the other. The Senate consists of 12 members. Each town containing 150 rateable polls sends one Representative, and every additional 300 polls entitles it to another. The Governor, Counsellors, Senators and Representatives are chosen on the 2d Tuesday of March in every year. The Constitution of N. H. was adopted Feb. 1792.

### MASSACHUSETTS.

The executive consists of a Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, and a Council of nine members. The two first are chosen by the people annually. The Council is chosen by the legislature out of the 40 returned as senators; and, if they decline, from the mass of the people. The legislature consists of a Senate and House of Representatives, both chosen annually by the people. The



Senators are chosen by districts; the Representatives by the towns. Each town having 150 rateable polls sends one, and another for every additional 225 polls. The legislature assemble annually in May and January, and on some special occasions oftener. The Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, and Senators, are chosen on the first Monday in April annually. The Representatives are chosen annually in May. The Constitution of Massachusetts was adopted March, 1780.

### CONNECTICUT.

The Charter of Charles II. in 1662 contains the Constitution of this State. The legislature is composed of a Council and House of Representatives. The Council consists of a Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, and 12 Assistants. The Governor presides, and has a vote, and a casting vote. They are all chosen annually on the 2d Monday in April: the two first directly from the mass of the people; the Assistants from a nomination of 20, which is filled up by the people in the preceding October. The House of Representatives is chosen twice a year, viz. on the 3d Monday in March, and 3d Monday in September; 20 towns send each two Representatives, and towns made since the charter send but one each. This government has been in operation more than 170 years.

### RHODE ISLAND.

The Charter of 1633 is the Constitution of this State. The legislature is composed of a Council of twelve, including the Governor and Deputy-Governor, all chosen annually; and a House of Representatives, consisting of 72 deputies from the several towns, chosen twice a year, viz. on the 3d Wednesday in April, and the 4th Tuesday in August.

### VERMONT.

The legislative power is vested in a House of Representatives, chosen annually on the 1st Tuesday in September, and to meet on the 2d Thursday of the succeeding October. Each inhabited town has a right to send one Representative to the Assembly. The executive power is vested in a Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, and twelve Counsellors, chosen annually on the



1st Tuesday in September. The Constitution of Vermont was adopted July 9, 1793.

#### *NEW-YORK.*

The legislature is composed of a Senate and House of Assembly. The Senators are chosen by districts, for four years. They are divided by lot into four classes. The seats of the first class are vacated in one year, the second class the second year, &c. so that a fourth part of the Senate is elected annually. Annual elections are on the last Tuesday in April and the two following days. Members of Assembly are chosen by the several counties annually. A council of revision, composed of the Governor, Chancellor, and the Judges of the Supreme Court, is empowered to revise all bills passed by the two Houses, and to return them to the House where they originated. If this is done, two thirds of both Houses must re-enact them, or they are defeated. If it is not done in ten days from the time a bill is passed, it becomes a law of course.

The executive is composed of a Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and Council of Appointment. The Governor is chosen every three years. The Lieutenant-Governor, chosen for the same time, is President of the Senate. The Council of Appointment consists of the Governor, and one Senator from each District, chosen annually by the Legislature. It has the appointment of all subordinate officers, executive and judicial.

#### *NEW-JERSEY.*

The legislature is composed of a Legislative Council and House of Assembly. The Council is chosen annually, and consists of thirteen members; each county choosing one. The Assembly consists of 35 members, also chosen yearly. The executive is composed of a Governor, annually chosen by a joint ballot of the legislature; a Vice-President, chosen by the Council; and a Privy Council, consisting of any three members of the Legislative Council. The Governor is President of the Council, Chancellor, Surrogate-General, and Captain-General. Annual elections in October.

#### *PENNSYLVANIA.*

The legislative power is vested in a Senate and House of Representatives. The Senators are chosen by



districts, and hold their offices four years. One fourth of them is elected annually. The Representatives are chosen annually by the city of Philadelphia, and the respective counties. The legislature meet once a year in December. The executive power is vested in a Governor, who is elected for three years; but cannot be chosen above 9 out of any 12 years. The candidate who has the highest number of votes is Governor, although he may not have a majority of all the votes.

#### DELAWARE.

The legislature consists of a Senate and House of Representatives. The Representatives are chosen annually on the 1st Tuesday in October, and by counties. The Senators are chosen triennially, and by counties. One third of the Senators go out annually. The Assembly meet in January. The Governor is chosen by the freemen triennially, and can hold the office only three, out of any term of six years. The Speaker of the Senate, in case of the absence, death, or resignation of the Governor, acts in his room.

Delaware had a smaller population than either of the States at each national enumeration. In 1810, it contained 72,674 inhabitants. Its constitution was adopted in June, 1792.

#### MARYLAND.

The legislature consists of the Senate and House of Delegates. The Senate is chosen by electors, who are elected by the freemen (on the first Monday in Sept.) every fifth year, two from a county, and one from each of the cities of Annapolis and Baltimore. The electors meet at Annapolis a fortnight after they are chosen, and elect by ballot 9 Senators from the western shore, and 6 from the eastern, who hold their station five years. The Delegates are chosen annually on the first Monday in October. The Assembly meets annually on the first Monday in November. The Governor, and an executive council of five persons, are chosen annually, on the second Monday in November, by a joint ballot of both Houses.

#### VIRGINIA.

The legislature is composed of a Senate and House of Representatives. The Senate consists of 24 members,







chosen for four years, by districts. One fourth of the Senate goes out yearly. The Representatives are chosen annually, two from each county, and one from several cities and burroughs each. The Governor is chosen annually by joint ballot of both Houses, and can hold the office but 3 years in 7. He has a privy council of 8 members, chosen by joint ballot of both Houses. The two Houses remove two of its members every 3 years, and appoint two new ones. The Council chooses its President, who in case of the death, resignation, or absence of the Governor, acts in his stead.

#### *NORTH-CAROLINA.*

The legislative power is vested in a Senate, and House of Commons. The Senators are chosen annually, one from each county. The members of the House of Commons are chosen annually, two from each county, and one from each of six towns. The Governor is chosen annually by a joint ballot of both Houses; and is eligible 3 years in six. The Executive Council consists of 7 persons chosen annually, by a joint ballot of the two Houses. Raleigh is the seat of government. The Constitution of this State was adopted Dec. 18, 1776.

#### *SOUTH-CAROLINA.*

The legislature consists of a Senate and House of Representatives. The Senate consists of 43 members chosen every 4 years by districts. Half of the Senators is chosen every 2 years. The Representatives are chosen every 2 years by districts. The Governor and Lieutenant-Governor are chosen biennially, by a joint ballot of both houses. Elections take place on the 2d Monday in October, and the day following; and the legislature meets annually on the 4th Monday in November. The Constitution was adopted June 3, 1790.

#### *GEORGIA.*

The legislature consists of a Senate and House of Representatives. The Senators are chosen annually by counties, one from each. The Representatives are chosen annually by counties; each sending at least one, and none more than four. The Assembly meets yearly on the 2d Tuesday in January. The Governor is chosen for two years, by the General Assembly.



*KENTUCKY.*

The legislative power is vested in a Senate and House of Representatives. The Senators are chosen by districts, and hold their seats four years. One fourth are re-chosen annually. Their number is limited to 38. The Representatives are chosen annually on the first Monday of August, chiefly by counties, and in a few instances by towns. Their number cannot exceed 100. The Assembly convenes on the first Monday in November. The Governor is chosen by the people once in four years, and is ineligible the succeeding seven. The Lieutenant-Governor is chosen for the same period, and in the same manner, and is President of the Senate. The Constitution of this State was adopted Aug. 17, 1799.

*TENNESSEE.*

This State is divided into five districts, and these into 38 counties. Its Constitution was adopted Feb. 6, 1796. The legislative authority is vested in a Senate and House of Representatives. The election for Governor and members of both Houses is biennial, on the first Thursday in August and the day succeeding; and the meeting of the General Assembly is on the 3d Monday of September. The Governor is vested with the executive power.

*OHIO.*

The legislative authority is vested in a Senate, chosen biennially, and a House of Representatives, chosen annually; both branches by the people. Annual elections are on the 2d Tuesday in October. The Senators are divided into two classes by lot; the seats of the first class to be vacated at the expiration of one year; of the second at the expiration of the second year; so that one half is to be chosen annually. The executive power is vested in a Governor, to be chosen biennially, by the people.

*LOUISIANA.*

This State is entitled to send two members to the Senate, and one member to the House of Representatives of the United States. Until a new census, it will of course choose three Electors of President and Vice-President. In 1810, the city, suburbs, and precincts of New-Orleans, contained 24,552 inhabitants; of whom 13,728 are whites, and 10,824 are slaves.



*INDIANA*

Admitted as a State 1816. Seat of government till 1825, is Corydon, on the Ohio river. The population in 1810, was 24,520; and in 1815, about 68,000. The executive power is vested in a Governor chosen for three years; and the legislative power in a Senate chosen for three years; and a house of Representatives chosen for one year. It has two Senators and one Representative in Congress.

*MISSISSIPPI.*

In 1817, the Mississippi Territory was divided; and the Western part lying on the Mississippi River, and extending from Tennessee to the gulph of Mexico, was erected into a State, by the name of Mississippi. The Eastern part was made a Territory, and called the Alabama. The State of Mississippi has two Senators, and one Representative in Congress. The Governor is elected for two years, the Senate for three, and the House of Representatives for one.

*DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA*

Is a square with a side of ten miles, and of course contains 100 square miles. It lies on both sides the Potomac, and includes the towns of Washington, Georgetown and Alexandria. It is divided into two counties; the county of Washington on the north side of the Potomac; and the county of Alexandria on the south side. In the former, the laws of Maryland are continued in force; in the latter, those of Virginia. Congress, however, makes what laws it pleases for both.

Washington city is built on the Maryland side of the Potomac, on a point of land between what is called the Eastern branch and the Potomac. Its plan as laid out, extends nearly four miles up each of those rivers. The Eastern Branch forms a safe and commodious harbour, being sufficiently deep for the largest ships, for about four miles above its mouth, while the channel lies close along the bank adjoining the city, and affords a large and convenient harbour. The capitol is situated on a pleasant eminence, commanding a view of every part of the city, and of a considerable portion of the country around. Such streets as lead immediately to public places are from 150 to 160 feet wide; others from 90



to 110. This city became the permanent seat of the National Government in 1800.

### *MISSOURI TERRITORY.*

This includes all of Louisiana, except the State of Louisiana; that is, all north of thirty-three degrees, North latitude. It probably contains 7 or 800,000 square miles. Population in 1810, was 20,845. St. Louis is the seat of government.

### *MICHIGAN TERRITORY.*

This Territory is divided into four districts, viz.—Eric, Detroit, Huron, and Michilimakinak. Its greatest length from South-east to North-west, is 500 miles; from North-east to South-west it is 300. The number of square miles, both of land and water, is estimated at 150,000. The legislative power is vested in a Governor and a Supreme Court, composed of three Judges, all appointed by the President of the United States. The executive power is vested in the Governor, and the judicial in the three Judges, and such civil magistrates in the various districts as the Governor shall appoint.

### *ILLINOIS TERRITORY.*

This is the western half of what was formerly called the Territory N. W. of the Ohio, and embraces the whole of it, except what is included in the State of Ohio, and the Territories of Michigan and Indiana. The whole tract contains about 200,000 square miles. It was a part of the Indiana Territory till 1809, when it was erected into a separate government. Population in 1810, was 12,282 inhabitants.

### *ALABAMA TERRITORY.*

This is the Eastern part of the former Mississippi Territory, and is bounded North by Tennessee, East by Georgia, South by Florida and the Gulf of Mexico, and West by the State of Mississippi. The population of this Territory and the State of Mississippi in 1816, was about 76,000; of which 30,000 were slaves. In 1810, the whole number was 40,000, of which 17,000 were slaves.

The Territory originally included in Louisiana, was estimated to contain nearly a million of square miles; as large an extent of country as the whole of the residue of the United States. In 1810, it contained 97,401 inhabitants.

[ADDITIONAL DUTIES.]

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted, That an addition of ten per centum shall be made to the several rates of duties, above specified, and imposed in respect to all*



goods, wares, and merchandize, on the importation of which in American or foreign vessels a specific discrimination has not been herein already made, which after the said 30th day of June, 1816, shall be imported in ships or vessels not of the United States: *Provided*, That this additional duty shall not apply to goods, wares, and merchandize imported in ships or vessels not of the United States, entitled by treaty or by any act or acts of Congress, to be entered in the ports of the United States, on the payment of the same duties as are paid on goods, wares, and merchandize, imported in ships or vessels of the United States.

[DRAWBACKS.]

SECT. 4 *And be it further enacted*, That there shall be allowed a drawback of the duties, by this act imposed, on goods, wares, and merchandize imported into the United States, upon the exportation thereof within the time, and in the manner prescribed by the existing laws, subject to the following provisions, that is to say: That there shall not be an allowance of the drawback of duties in the case of goods imported in foreign vessels from any of the dominions, colonies, or possessions of any foreign power, to and with which the vessels of the United States are not permitted to go and trade; that there shall not be an allowance of the drawback of duties for the amount of the additional duties by this act imposed on goods imported in vessels not of the United States; that there shall not be an allowance of the drawback in the case of foreign dried and pickled fish, and other salted provisions, fish oil or playing cards; that there shall be deducted and retained from the amount of the duties on goods exported with the benefit of drawback, (other than spirits) two and a half per centum; and that there shall be retained in the case of spirits exported with the benefit of drawback, two cents per gallon upon the quantity of spirits, and also three per centum on the amount of duties payable on the importation thereof. But, nevertheless, the provisions of this act shall not be deemed in anywise to impair any rights and privileges, which have been or may be acquired by any foreign nation under the laws and treaties of the United States, upon the subject of exporting





goods from the United States, with the benefit of a drawback of the duties payable upon the importation thereof.

[EXPORTATION BONDS.]

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted*, That after the 30th day of June next, in all cases of entry of merchandise, for the benefit of drawback, the time of twenty days shall be allowed from the date of the entry, for giving the exportation bonds for the same : *Provided*, That the exporter shall, in every other particular, comply with the regulations and formalities, heretofore established for entries of exportation for the benefit of drawback.

[TONNAGE DUTY.]

SECT. 6. *And be it further enacted*, That the duty on the tonnage of vessels, and the bounties, advances, and drawbacks in the case of exporting pickled fish, of the fisheries of the United States, in the case of American vessels employed in the fisheries, and in the case of exporting sugar refined within the United States, shall be, and continue the same as the existing law provides : *Provided always*, That this provision shall not be deemed in any wise to impair any rights and privileges, which have been, or may be acquired by any foreign nation, under the laws and treaties of the United States, relative to the duty of tonnage on vessels.

[COLLECTION LAWS SAME AS FORMERLY.]

SECT. 7. *And be it further enacted*, That the existing laws shall extend to, and be in force for the collection of the duties imposed by this act on goods, wares, and merchandise imported into the United States ; and for the recovery, collection, distribution, and remission of all fines, penalties, and forfeitures, and for the allowance of the drawbacks and bounties by this act authorized, as fully and effectually as if every regulation, restriction, penalty, forfeiture, provision, clause, matter and thing, in the existing laws contained, had been inserted in, and re-enacted by this act, and that all acts and parts of acts, which are contrary to this act, and no more, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.



[LAW REPEALING DISCRIMINATING DUTIES,  
CONTINUED.]

SECT. 8. *And be it further enacted*, That the act passed the third day of March, 1815, entitled "An act to repeal so much of the several acts imposing duties on the tonnage of ships and vessels, and on goods, wares, and merchandize imported into the United States, as impose a discriminating duty on the tonnage between foreign vessels, and vessels of the United States, and between goods imported into the United States in foreign vessels and vessels of the United States," shall apply and be in full force as to the discriminating duties established by this act on the tonnage of foreign vessels, and the goods, wares, and merchandize therein imported.

## UNIVERSITY AT CAMBRIDGE, OR HARVARD COLLEGE.

The General Court of the Colony of Massachusetts Bay, in Sept. 1636, appropriated £ 400 for a School or College within the Government; and appointed and named six Magistrates, and six Elders to order the College. In 1637, they voted that the College should be erected at Newtown. In the year following, they changed the name of Newtown to Cambridge, and in March, 1638—9 enacted that the College to be built at Cambridge, should be called Harvard College, in honour of the Rev. John Harvard, who had bequeathed to it £ 779:17:2, with his library. In the year 1642, the General Court established the Board of Overseers, to consist of the Governor, Deputy-Governor, for the time being, all the Magistrates of the jurisdiction, with the teaching Elders of the six next adjoining towns; who were invested with power to make statutes and laws for the government of the College, and to dispose and manage its funds.

In May, 1650, the Charter of the Corporation was granted; said Corporation to consist of a President, five Fellows and a Treasurer, styled the President and Fellows of Harvard College. By this Charter, the Corporation procuring the presence of the Overseers, and by their counsel and consent, have power to fill vacancies in their own body. They are authorized to receive and hold real estate, not exceeding the value of £ 500 per ann. and any goods and sums of money whatsoever; and to make conclusive bargains for lands and tenements, &c. They are to choose and remove officers, and make orders and by-laws for the carrying on the work of the College; provided the said orders be allowed by the Overseers. By an act of the Court in 1657, called an Appendix to the Charter, the acts of the President and Fellows have immediate force and effect; they being responsible for the same to the Overseers. The Constitution of the Commonwealth recognizes and confirms the powers of the Corporation and Overseers of Harvard College or the University in Cambridge, pointing out the successors to the former Overseers, and reserving to the Legislature of the State such control over the government of the College, as was possessed by the Legislature of the late Province. By an act of the Legislature in 1814, the Corporation may hold real estate, and thereby

The Boylston Medical Library, exceeding 600 vols. is distinct from the public Library of the University.

Candidates for *admission* to the freshman class, must be well versed in ancient and modern geography, and in the grammar and prosody of the Latin and Greek languages; be able to translate English into Latin correctly, and to construe and parse any portion of the following books, viz. Dalgel's Collectanea, Græca Minora, the Greek Testament, Virgil, Sallust, and Cicero's select Orations. They must be well versed in the following parts of *arithmetick*, viz. the fundamental rules, vulgar and decimal fractions, extraction of the roots, the doctrine of proportion simple and compound, with its ordinary applications, and algebra to the end of simple equations. By the applications of proportion is meant single and double fellowship, tare and trett, loss and gain, commission, brokerage and insurance, allegation medial and alternate. The rules excepted from the requisition are circulating decimals, arithmetical and geometrical progression, interest, equation of payments, annuities, position single and double, permutation, combination and composition of quantities and logarithms; these rules being embodied in the algebra.

The usual time of examination for the freshman class is the Friday next after Commencement.

The time of *residence* of undergraduates at the University, except for those, who enter at an advanced standing, is four years.



The *charges* in the College bills, amount to about 220 dollars annually, including board, room, instruction, fuel, books used in the classes; and certain contingent expenses.

*Summary of the Method of Treatment to be used with Persons apparently dead from Drowning, &c.*

**THE RESUSCITATIVE PROCESS**, recommended by the Humane Society.

CONVEY the person to the nearest convenient house with his head raised; strip and dry him as quick as possible: clean the mouth and nostrils from froth and mud. If a child, let him be placed between two persons naked, in a hot bed. If an adult, lay him on a hot blanket or bed, and in cold weather, near a fire; in warm weather the air should be freely admitted into the room. The body is next to be gently rubbed with warm woollen cloths, sprinkled with spirits, if at hand, otherwise dry. A heated warming-pan may be now lightly moved over the back, properly covered with a blanket; and the body, if of a child, is to be gently shook every few minutes. Whilst these means are using, let a glass of warm water, with as much common salt as it will dissolve, be thrown into the bowels. Bathe the breast with hot rum; and persist in the use of these means for several hours. If no signs of life should then appear, let the body be kept warm several hours longer, with hot bricks, or vessels of hot water, applied to the palms of the hands and soles of the feet; and





this for a longer or shorter time, as the circumstances of the case may dictate.

The too customary method of rolling on a barrel, suspending by the feet, and every violent mode of agitation, particularly in removing the body from the water, should be most carefully avoided.

To restore breathing, introduce the pipe of a bellows (when no apparatus is at hand) into one of the nostrils, the other and mouth being closed; *inflate the lungs*, until the breast is a little raised; mouth and nostrils must then be let free. Repeat this process until life appear.

Electricity is recommended to be early employed by judicious practitioners.


#### General Observations.—*Resuscitation.*

On the *dawn* or first indication of returning life, the prudent practitioner will resign the office of *Art* to *Nature*. It is evident that *Art* has contributed her share, by enabling *Nature* to struggle with the immediate cause of oppression. It is in fact this judicious blending of *Nature* with *Art* that gives to the latter all its efficacy.

#### *On signs of returning life.*

A tea-spoonful of warm water may be given; and if swallowing be returned, warm wine or diluted brandy. The patients must be laid in a warm bed, and if disposed to sleep, they will generally awake perfectly restored.

The plans above recommended are to be used three or four hours. It is an absurd and vulgar opinion, to suppose persons irrecoverable, because life does not soon make its appearance.

 Bleeding never to be employed, unless by the direction of a physician.

*THE GENERAL REGISTRY OFFICE*

Is an establishment important to strangers as well as citizens. It is of recent date, and the only one of the kind ever formed in New-England. It is an Office through which any kind of estate or property, such as houses and tenements of any sort; farms, tracts of land, ships, exchange, and property of almost any description, may be bought, sold, let, hired or exchanged; an Office through which strangers and foreigners can obtain such advice and information, houses or lodgings, and assistants, as may be wanted; where also the stranger, on arriving in town, can leave his name and place where to be found, that in case any thing unforeseen should befall his family, or property, after leaving his home, which might require his immediate attention, he could with certainty and readiness be informed of it; and where, likewise, are drawn Deeds, Leases, Wills, Agreements, Petitions, Charterparties, and all other Writings, which may be desired.—It is at No. 2, Water Street, near Cornhill, Boston,—and is conducted by S. P. Heywood.

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By the Report of a Committee, dated October, 1817, on the state of Schools in Boston, made by the authority of the town, it appears, that there are one hundred sixty-two private schools, of various descriptions, in which 4132 children attend, who are between the age of 4 and 14 years. The annual expense of these private schools is 49,154 dollars. Of this sum, the expense of the schools for children between the age of 4 and 7, is 18,911 dollars. Two hundred eighty-three children, between 4 and 7 years of age, do not attend any school. Two hundred forty-three children, above 7 years of age, do not attend any school. In the schools maintained at the public expense, 2365 children are instructed—1579 boys, 786 girls.

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Mr. Patterson, Director of the Mint, reported to the President in January, 1817, that in 1816, there were coined 2,888,134 cents, 47,150 Half Dollars, and 20,000 Dollars.—Total, 35,785 dollars, 57 cents.

All merchandize shipped *off* the wharf, to pay the same as for *landing*, excepting such goods, as *have paid for landing*, (and not having been carried *off* wharf) are put on board vessels within one month after they were landed.

Goods taken *in* lighters or otherwise by *water*, from on board any vessel lying at the wharf, or goods taken *from* lighters or otherwise, by *water*, on *board* any vessel lying at the wharf, to pay one half as much as for *landing*, the said half wharfage to be paid by the vessel lying at the wharf.

The wharfage of Goods *landed* to be paid by the seller, or person landing the same, except *wood and lumber*, which is to be paid by the purchaser.

Goods received from, or loaded on board coasters, to be paid for by the captains of coasters; unless the same are shipped or received by persons belonging to Boston, and a return thereof to be made by the master of the coaster to the wharfinger.

Goods brought on the wharf, by trucks, or otherwise, for public sale, to pay the same wharfage, as if landed thereon.

Vessels hauling to the wharf, are expected to have their jibs, spanker-booms, and spritsail-yards rigged in, and on the north side to have their yards topped, and to accommodate other vessels as much as possible.

No boats are to be put on the wharf; nor sand, gravel, or other ballast to be landed without permission of the wharfinger; nor the dirt or sweepings of the hold, or other articles which do not float, under any pretence whatever, to be thrown into the dock.

No fires allowed to be kept on board any vessel lying on the north side of the wharf above the T.

Vessels coming to the north side of the wharf, above the T, are to be allowed two days only to discharge or load; and in case the berth be then wanted by the proprietor or occupant of the neighbouring store, the vessel that has laid that time, must remove if requested.
