

#### ECLIPSES IN 1839.

1. The first will be a great and total eclipse, on Friday March 15th, at 9h. 28m. morning, but by reason of the moon's south latitude, her shadow will not touch any part of North America.

The course of the general eclipse will be from southwest to northeast, from the Pacific Ocean a little west of Chili to the Arabian Gulf and southeastern part of the Mediterranean Sea. The termination of this grand and sublime phenomenon will probably be witnessed from the summit of some of those stupendous monuments of ancient industry and folly, the vast and lofty pyramids on the banks of the Nile in lower Egypt. The principal cities and places that will be totally shadowed in this eclipse, are Valparaiso, Mendoza, Cordova, Assumption, St. Salvador and Pernambuco, in South America, and Sierra Leone, Teemboo, Tombucto and Fezzan, in Africa. At each of these places the duration of total darkness will be from one to six minutes, and several of the planets and fixed stars will probably be visible.

2. The other will also be a grand and beautiful eclipse, on Saturday, September 7th, at 5h. 35m. evening, but on account of the Moon's low latitude, and happening so late in the afternoon, no part of it will be visible in North America.

Its whole course will be in the Pacific Ocean, from the island of Niphon, in the east of Asia, to Juan Fernandez, near the southwestern coast of South America. The only people of our terrestrial planet who will have an opportunity of witnessing this beautiful and sublime phenomenon, will be the inhabitants of the aforesaid islands, and of the Sandwich and Society groups; except perchance some few others who "go down to the sea in ships, and do business on the great waters." Spofford.

But if published periodically, the postage is, not over 100 miles, 1 1-2 cent; over 100 miles, 2 1-2 cents.

# The Convention of the Congregational Ministers in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts

Is a voluntary Association, embracing all the Congregational Clergy of the Commonwealth, but vested with no particular authority or control over the churches.

Their meeting is held in Boston, on the last Wednesday in May, annually, at half past three, P. M. and the following day. After transacting the usual business of the Convention, a sermon is delivered in public before them, and a collection made for the charitable purpose of relieving the indigent Widows of Congregational clergymen.

The Officers of the Convention at present are— Rev. George Ripley, of Boston, Treasurer.

For the purpose of investigating cases of necessity, and of application for the charity of the Convention. there are two standing Committees; a Central Committee, chosen centrally, and a Reporting Committee, whose members reside in different parts of the State. The Reporting Committee are required, each year, to investigate the circumstances of the objects of this charity, whether already on the list, or needing, or applying the first time for aid, and make a particular statement to the Central Committee, directed to the Scribe of the Convention, at least one week before the meeting of the Convention. Should any member neglect so to do for two successive years, his place in the Reporting Committee shall be vacated. The Central Committee receive from the members of the Reporting Committee applications and statements of facts in behalf of subjects of the charity of the Convention, and, having considered the same, are to judge of the persons to be relieved, and the proportion to be given to each, and make report to the Convention, on the first day of their meeting, annually.

The statements of the members of the Reporting Committee are expected to contain answers to the following questions—

1. What is her age?

- 2. What are the number, the sex, the ages, and the circumstances of her children?
  - 3. What is a fair estimate of her property?

4. What is her ability to help herself?

5. What Connexions has she, who are bound to afford her assistance? And in what way do they assist her?

6. What is her income?

7. What peculiar circumstances render her an object of charity; or make it desirable that she should have aid this year?

Extract from an Act to modify the Act of July 14, 183! relating to Duties.

Be it Enacted, &c. That from and after the 31st of December, 183 in all cases where duties are imposed on foreign imports by the act the 14th of July, 1832, entitled, "An Act to alter and amend th several acts imposing duties on imports," or by any other act, sha exceed 20 per ct. on the value thereof, one tenth part of such exces shall be deducted; from and after the 31st of December, 1835, another tenth part thereof shall be deducted; from and after the 31st of Dec 1837, another tenth part thereof shall be deducted; from and after the 31st of December, 1839, another tenth part thereof shall be deducted and from and after the 31st of December, 1841, one half of the residu of such excess shall be deducted; and from and after the 30th o June, 1842, the other half thereof shall be deducted.

# ARMY REGISTER.

On the 19th of May, 1837, an alteration was made in the line marking the limits of the two great military This line now commences at the mouth of divisions. the Mississippi, thence proceeding up that river to Cassville, in the Territory of Wisconsin; and thence north to the line of demarkation between the United States and Canada. All west of that line forms the Western Division; and all east, the Eastern Division.

Two aids-de-camp are allowed to each of the generals commanding the two divisions, and one Inspector-General is attached as chief of the staff to perform the duties of Adjutant and Inspector-General; -Col. John E. Wool is Inspector-General of the Western Division: and Col. George Croghan of the Eastern Division.

The two Divisions are subdivided into the following seven Departments.

Department 1. All the country embraced within the Western Division above the 37th deg. N. Lat.

Department 2. All the country within the Western Division below the 37th deg. N. Lat.

Department 3. The States of Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi, Louisiana, Alabama, Georgia, and the Territory of Florida.

Department 4. South Carolina, North Carolina, and Virginia.

## An Act relating to Days of Grace on Commercial Paper, in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority

of the same, as follows:

In all cases where bills of exchange, drafts, or promissory notes shall become due and payable on Sunday, on the annual thanksgiving and fast days, or on the fourth day of July, the same shall be payable on the day next preceding such Sunday, annual thanksgiving and fast days, and fourth day of July; and in case of non-payment may be noted and protested on such preceding day; provided, that it shall not be necessary for the holder or holders of such bills of exchange, drafts or promissory notes to give notice of the dishonor thereof, until the day next after such Sunday, thanksgiving and fast days, or fourth day of July; and every such notice so given shall be valid and effectual to all intents and purposes.

In a healthy person, the heart makes eighty pulsations in one minute; and it is supposed that two ounces and a half of blood are expelled into the aorta at each pulsation; consequently not less than nine thousand and six hundred ounces are thrown into this vessel in an hour. At each pulsation this quantity of blood is said to be propelled eight inches, which is more than fifty three feet in one minute. The average quantity of blood in a human body is about thirty pounds, all of which passes through the heart in the space of one hour.

#### EMIGRATION FROM ENGLAND.

An account of all emigrants, who have left London from the 7th of May, 1833, to 30th of December, 1837, to settle in the British Colonies and in the United States, says, that there were 1416 ships, with a tonnage of 636,336 tons and 26,495 seamen employed, who carried 112,172 persons, of all ages and sexes, and that of this whole number only 8379 came to the Canadas, and the rest, 99,635, came to the United States.

In the last year only, the emigrants from the port of Liverpool were 32,045, of whom 28,713 came to the United States.

In July, 1833, the State Banks and branches were 829. The Presidents, Directors and other officers, is not over estimated at 8,200.—Stockholders at 650,000. The aggregate of these is nearly a million of persons, whose business, relations and pecuniary interests are involved. The capital of all the Banks is about \$317.636,770; of loans, \$485,631,867. A mass of about one million of persons, and money and credit to an amount exceeding five hundred millions of dollars, are, in a great degree, dependent upon the operations of this bank credit system.

# DR. HERSCHEL'S TABLE

For Foretelling the Weather, through all the Lunations of each Year, forever,-amended by

### DR. ADAM CLARKE.

This table and the accompanying remarks are the result of many ears' actual observation; the whole being constructed on a due con-ideration of the attraction of the sun and moon, in their several poitions respecting the earth, and will, by simple inspection, show the bserver what kind of weather will most probably follow the entrance f the moon into any of its quarters, and that so near the truth as to e seldom or never found to fail.

Observations .- 1. The nearer the time of the moon's change, first quarter, full and last quarter, are to midnight, the fairer will the weaher be during the seven days following.

2. The space for this calculation occupies from ten at night till two lext morning.

3. The nearer to mid-day or noon, the phases of the moon happen, he more foul or wet weather may be expected during the next seven lays.

4. The space for this calculation occupies from ten in the forenoon to two in the afternoon. These observations refer principally to the summer, though they affect spring and autumn nearly in the same ratio.

5. The moon's change, first quarter, full, and last quarter, happenng during six of the afternoon hours, i. e. from four to ten, may be followed by fair weather; but this is mostly dependent on the wind, as is noted in the table.


6. Though the weather, from a variety of irregular causes, is more uncertain in the latter part of autumn, the whole of winter, and the beginning of spring, yet, in the main, the above observations will apply to those periods also.


