 Judge Speer said that this class was the best that has ever graduated from Mercer. Eight one-hundredths were made on

constitutional law and the general average of the class on constitutional law was 98.4. General average in all departments is higher than ever before.
 Mr. Arthur Coddington won Judge Speer's prize consisting of two books on the Georgia code. This prize was won by Mr. Coddington putting up the best paper on the constitution of the United States. Mr. Coddington also won the Steed medal for writing the best thesis of law on "Law governing Relations of Husband and Wife." This medal was offered by Hon. C. P. Steed, a member of the Mercer faculty.
 Following the delivery of just named prizes, Judge Speer in his eloquent and polished style, delivered a masterful piece of oratory. President P. D.
