

BE BEAUTY HELD FOR MURDER

**NAN PATTERSON
FACE JURY FOR HER
ON CHARGE OF KILLING
MAKER CAESAR YOUNG.**

(Dispatch to The Journal.)
ATLANTA, June 11.—By 1 o'clock
this afternoon all proceedings before
the grand jury in the case of "Nan"
Patterson, charged with the murder of
her lover, Caesar Young, will have come to an end.
If an indictment will have
been returned and the case will
be in the hands of the coroner.
If there will be only a short and
summary inquest as to the cause of
the fatal verdict to the
young man, Caesar Young, came to his
end in the hands of some person or
persons known to the jury.

A judgment has been found against
the murder in the first degree.
The return is delayed only through
the necessity for correcting a clerical er-
ror in filling out the printed blank.
The official function of the coroner
will be soon as the indictment is re-
turned. The girl will be remanded to
prison without bail as heretofore to
the action of the district attorney.
Of these facts it is not likely
that important testimony will be
given by the inquest. The district at-
torney is not at all likely to permit the
coroner to proceed in the method in which
he is likely to divulge any of the
important evidence in his posses-
sion. An adjournment will be
made as soon as the coroner's court
is forced to proceed the dis-
