DONALD FRASER BOYS GRADUATE AT DECATUR

NOTABLE PROGRAM RENDERED.

**C. M. CANDLER PRESIDES AND
HOOPER ALEXANDER AND
W. W. ORR SPEAK.**

The annual commencement exercises of
the Donald Fraser High school occurred
Thursday at Decatur, this commencement
being one of the most brilliant that school
has ever held.

Hon. C. M. Candler presided, and he de-
livered the banner for the champion de-
bate to the Ciceronian Literary society.
W. W. Orr, of Atlanta, delivered the
medal for the best essay on American
history, and Hon. Hooper Alexander de-
livered the oratorical medal. Both made
delightful speeches.

The following pupils were awarded
medals: Neal Goss, Decatur, oratory;
John Fort, Atlanta, history; R. C. Mc-
Intosh, Quitman, essay; Tom Vereen,
Moultrie, best declaimer, and Murray
Mack, Fort Mill, S. C., who won first
honor or the scholarship medal. The sec-
ond honor was won by Clifford Cowles,
of Decatur. The young men who con-
tested for the declaimers' medal acquitted
themselves with great credit. Tom Pow-
ell, of Newnan, won prolonged applause.

Among the agreeable features of this
school is the establishment of a scholar-
ship for DeKalb county boys named for
Milton A. Candler, and offered by Prof.
G. Holman Gardner.
