Splendid Work Done by Students During the Year—List of Prize Winners.

At the close of the fourteenth year of the Donald Fraser school the following prizes were awarded: First honor, William Steele, Jr., of Lafayette, Ga., whose yearly average was 95.73; second honor, Clifford Cowles, Jr., Decatur, Ga., whose yearly average was 95.41, this being the fourth time that he had secured either first or second honor at the school.
